THE MEANING OF EPIPHANY

I recall many years ago being very surprised to learn from a letter that I received from a sponsored child in Ethiopia that his family and his country celebrates Christmas on January 6th. I later realized that in Ethiopia and other countries, particularly with Eastern Orthodox tradition, the day of Epiphany includes the celebration of the Nativity. Are these days the same? Did the Magi arrive that night along with the Shepherds? How exactly are these two celebrations connected? The beginning of Chapter 2 of the Gospel according to Matthew makes the timing clearer for us. It says that “when Jesus was born” the Magi arrived in Jerusalem asking, “Where is the newborn king of the Jews?” Then they first met with Herod before following the star to the birthplace of Jesus. Regardless of exactly when the Magi arrived to see the newborn king the celebration of God’s Epiphany has a rich history that is intertwined with Christmas.

The word Epiphany means “to show” or to “make known” or even “to reveal.” In terms of our Christian understanding, an epiphany is a manifestation of Christ’s glory and divinity. So, in our early Church history, the feast of “epiphanies” was celebrated as a commemoration of many events that revealed the glory of God: the Nativity, the visit of the Magi, Our Lord’s Baptism, and the Miracle at the Wedding Feast at Cana. This tradition developed primarily in the East and was introduced in the West after the celebration of the Nativity took root. Therefore, the Church in the West celebrated Nativity and Epiphany in two distinct celebrations, while in the East, the celebration of these events occurred as one holiday. Eventually, at Jerusalem, a tradition developed that on the eve of Epiphany, groups of pilgrims would leave each night from one or another Church in the holy city to Bethlehem and return the next day. This would go on for several days. Traditions like this led to a much closer tie in the celebration of Epiphany to our Savior’s birth, of his Baptism, and the miracle at Cana. Then, in the Western Church, the date of the celebration of the Nativity was decided to be December 25th in order to coincide with the pagan celebration of the birthday of the sun at the winter solstice. This transfer was believed to have given rise to the twelve days of Christmas.

All of this history sheds light on the true meaning of Epiphany: God has revealed his glory! That the Magi could be led by a star reveals that God is intimately involved in our lives and has come to save us! That God could continue to show signs of his great love in moments like Jesus’ baptism and reveal the love of the Trinity to us is meant to gladden our hearts, give us joy and peace, and give us resolve to follow the one who leads us to salvation!

OUR CHRISTMAS WISH LIST

Each week, Guardian Angels records and streams the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass as well as some Holy Days and funerals, etc. The recorded Masses are then available for viewing any time on the parish's YouTube channel linked at our website www.gachaska.org. This ministry helps bring our Masses to the Homebound and family and friends who might not be able to attend a funeral or a wedding.

For the past four years we have been using aging, reused videocams and other equipment that are starting to become unreliable. But now, we have sourced the following equipment that is modern, reliable and affordable:

2 Pan, Tilt, Zoom Cameras able to be remotely controlled	\$2,600.00
1 Keyboard/Joystick to control the cameras	\$1,250.00

With this equipment, the livestreamer will be able to remotely control the cameras (while singing in the choir) and generate tighter and more professional shots that can be aired on our YouTube channel.

Furthermore, we are working with the city of Chaska to air the Mass on one of the local cable access channels so that those without a computer can simply tune into the Mass on television. This is so important to be able to do and we need reliable and updated cameras in order to do it!

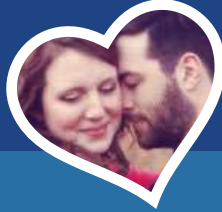
