THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

This past Monday we had a very beautiful celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours Evening Prayer on the feast day of the Baptism of the Lord. This concluded our hour of Eucharistic Adoration with Benediction. This celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours always officially marks the close of the Christmas season. We can think of the Christmas season as a time of Epiphanies or revelations from God that are rather intense.

First we have the Nativity in which Jesus is born among us as a helpless, tender child. God makes Himself small for us in order to establish his communion with us once again. Then we have the Epiphany in which the Magi represented all the nations. We hear from the prophet, Isaiah, that "Every nation on earth will adore you, Lord." Then, we fast forward 30 years into Jesus' life here on earth and celebrate his Baptism as part of the Christmas season. Sometimes, if Epiphany falls early enough in January, the Baptism of the Lord is celebrated on the following Sunday. But more often, this feast is celebrated on the Monday immediately following the Sunday of Epiphany.

So why does the Church include this feast day in the Christmas season? It is because it confirms the identity of the child born in Bethlehem. Jesus is the Father's beloved son, in whom he is well-pleased. Why was Jesus baptized? This is a good question. With the event of his own baptism, Jesus stepped out of His hidden life into the light of public life. Yet, even John the Baptist stood and questioned him saying that Jesus should baptize him and not the other way around. John was calling people to conversion and penitence. The external sign of this was immersion in the water of the Jordan, an act and a symbol of cleansing. He was trying to prepare people for the coming of the Messiah. They were to change their lives and to be on the alert for the coming of the great time of renewal. He called the coming Savior someone "mightier than I" and saw himself as merely his servant.

John's surprise must have been great as the great one whose coming John had proclaimed came humbly and quietly, like one sinner among others. What did it mean? John received an answer "from heaven." God gave us to understand that Jesus' attitude was pleasing to Him, and that in doing this, Jesus was showing Himself to be God's "beloved Son."

In this act of baptism, we see the humility of God. John's baptism was for penitents who had recognized that they had sinned and begged God for purification from their sins. Jesus, in being baptized, showed His solidarity with us. He would take on his shoulders the burden of the sins of all humanity. We see the harmony within the Trinity as Jesus submitted himself to the Father's loving plan. We see Jesus dying to Himself, taking on our sins so that we might be in communion with Him again. Therefore, we see ourselves being drawn into loving communion with the Trinity.

We are first drawn into that loving communion through our baptism. Our baptism is of supreme importance. It was the day that the Trinity entered our hearts. Our culture tends to emphasize our birth dates as an occasion for celebration, but we as Christians should also keep in mind the date of our Baptism. Do you know the date you were baptized? Pope Francis called this date a new birthday "...because with your baptism you were born into the life of grace." Let's be sure to celebrate our baptismal dates and light your baptismal candles as a reminder of your new life in Christ!

We have opportunities to celebrate, to find out if others need our prayers, to help someone feel a little less lonely, or just to catch up with old and new friends.

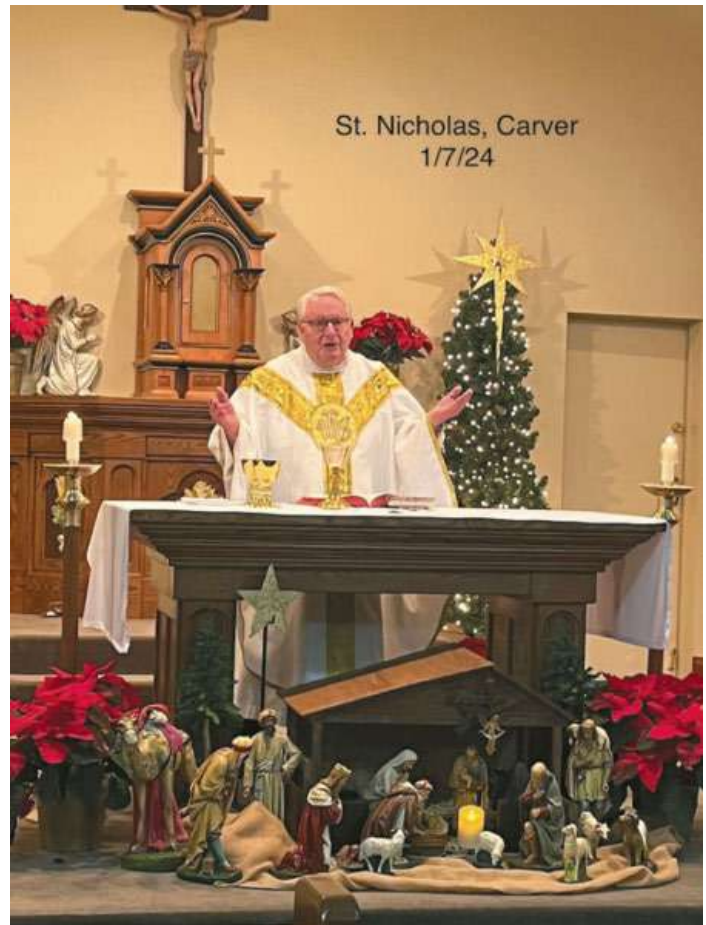

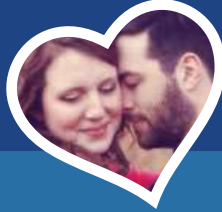
