## GET ON THE BUS FOR LIFE!

Minnesota is not so nice anymore. This past January 11<sup>th</sup>, at our Minnesota Citizens Concerned for Life presentation here at Guardian Angels, we learned more about how in 2023, the Minnesota legislature and Gov. Tim Walz enacted laws enshrining abortion up to birth, repealing a program supporting pregnant women, and taking away the right of newborn babies to lifesaving care.

Did you know that Minnesota's abortion policy is now as extreme as any in the world?

Abortion in Minnesota is legal for any reason and at any time up to birth. It is even legal late in pregnancy, when unborn children can feel excruciating pain and when the health risks to pregnant women increase. Non-physicians are now allowed to perform abortions (even late-term surgical abortions), and abortion facilities are not licensed or inspected by the state. More than 40 percent of abortions are funded by taxpayers through the state's Medicaid program. As a result of these extreme laws and repealing of laws, 12,175 abortions took place in Minnesota in 2023, according to the Minnesota Department of Health. That's a sharp 20 percent increase over the previous year.

In 2023, DFL legislative majorities and Gov. Tim Walz enacted legislation enshrining a "fundamental right" to abortion up to birth in Minnesota statute. They also repealed most of Minnesota's longstanding abortion laws, including laws ensuring informed consent for women and preventing non-physicians from performing abortions. They even repealed Minnesota's Positive Alternatives Act that provided support and alternatives to abortion for pregnant women who want to carry their babies to term.

Minnesota law used to guarantee lifesaving care for infants who survive abortion. In 2023, though, the legislature and Gov. Walz repealed the requirement that "reasonable measures consistent with good medical practice" be taken "to preserve the life and health of the born alive infant." They replaced the requirement for lifesaving measures with a requirement for only "care" (which lawmakers described as mere "comfort care"). Moreover, the new law no longer applies specifically to babies who survive abortion, but rather to **all** babies who are born alive.

Under the new language, then, **any viable infant, whether born as a result of abortion or not**, could be denied lifesaving care and allowed to die. Babies born with disabilities, whose lives are often devalued, could be especially at risk. We learned that there are two jurisdictions in the world where such radical laws are in place – Minnesota and China. The philosophy of abortion (and euthanasia, for that matter) that you are too expensive, you do not contribute anything, and we can't afford you is not on the side of compassion! Furthermore, not just mothers and fathers struggling with unplanned pregnancies, but for a young couple or quite possibly in the future, a grown family struggling to care for their loved one, this could be your and my problem too!

Get on the bus that leaves from Chanhassen this Monday, January 22nd, at 9:30 AM and join in the Prayer Service for Life and the MCCL March for Life at the Capitol and plan to return around 2:00 PM. ### THANK YOU FOR YOUR STEWARDSHIP!

Dear parishioners of Guardian Angels,

This past autumn, Deacon John and I explained that our donated income need here at Guardian Angels to balance our anticipated expenses would be an estimated \$735,300 with any rectory rental and gym rental income bringing this number down. We began the year into the autumn season accumulating a budget deficit that I saw reach some \$57,000 in the time period of July to date. Now, due to your diligent and conscientious participation and support, we saw that number decrease to under \$15,000 after the January 7th collection. Thank you so much! This gives us great hope and enables us to do our budgeting next year with not quite as much pressure. Now, however, we are seeing this number rise to just under \$20,000, so please continue your generous giving. Again, we have about \$120,000 in our savings, which is something we do not want to touch. May God bless our stewardship and faithfulness!

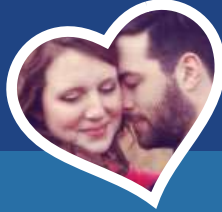
