COMPOSURE AND ACTION

Dear Parishioners,

As you know, I have been offering reflections before our Sunday Masses about the liturgy as we move into Lent. This Sunday I will reflect on the Introductory Rites. Below is a further reflection on composure which I spoke about last Sunday. It is a very abridged version of Chapter 5, "*Composure and Action*" from the book, *Meditations before Mass* by Msgr. Romano Guardini.

Just as proper speech and hearing emerge from silence, good action emerges from composure. Action is more than mere external happening. In our relations with each other, service, friendship, and love are genuine only to the degree that we inwardly participate in it. The more noble and important the task, the more we must give it our attention, and eagerness, participating in it from the heart and with all the creative ability of the mind. That is composure: heart and mind concentrated on the here and now. It is being all here.

This is true especially of the Liturgy. Liturgy is a great mystery, God's presence in a holy place, and needs as a response that we appear before that presence. But we must be truly present -- with body, mind, and soul, with attention, reverence and love. Only the one who is composed can appear before God to respond to his outpouring of grace with adoration and love.

In terms of our gestures, sitting signifies more than mere comfort; it is the position of attentive listening. Kneeling is the offering of our erect position before God. Standing is more than the attitude of expectant waiting; it is the bearing of reverence before the heavenly Lord. To truly see the altar is to truly grasp its essence and significance. The gaze we direct toward it is as significant as the composure from which it comes. We do not come to church to merely attend the service as a spectator would, but in order, along with the priest, to serve God. Everything we do including all our gestures is meant to be divine service, but this only happens with true awareness of what is happening around us -- and this awareness is ours when all we do overflows from a collected heart and the mind's attentiveness which comes from composure.

Liturgy doesn't have a utilitarian purpose like other actions. Therefore, composure is all the more necessary. When I seat myself at a desk and pick up a manuscript, my attention naturally passes to it. When I do a job in my workshop, I'd better pull myself together or it will go awry. In the Mass there are no such purposes. We simply step into the presence of God and remain there for God. The Liturgy is a thing of exalted purposelessness, but it is filled with a sense of sacred serving, and over it reigns the transcendence of God. Here composure means everything and therefore must be willed and practiced. Our service can grow dull, careless, and not honoring of God or it can be lively with full communion with the divine Majesty.

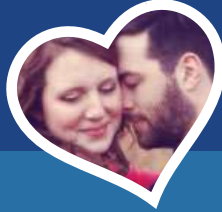
