CONGRATULATIONS FIRST COMMUNICATS AND LET'S CELEBRATE CHILDREN!

"People were bringing even infants to him that he might touch them, and when the disciples saw this, they rebuked them. Jesus, however, called the children to himself and said, "Let the children come to me and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Amen, I say to you, whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it." Luke 18: 15-17.

This Saturday evening and Sunday we celebrate holy communion with those receiving our Lord for the first time. It is a great opportunity to reflect back on our own first communion and remember how, through nothing we really did on our own, God led us to our Catholic faith. Most of us received the gift of faith as young children who only did what was asked (sometimes) and learned about our Lord Jesus in a typical eager fashion that children often exhibit. My first holy communion was in the mid-70's and, as that particular era goes, I wore plaid pants, an orange shirt and a white tie. Those days are a distant memory, but I do remember the day being special in which the Lord revealed his great love for me.

Jesus welcomes all and, with a tender heart, young children. At another parish, I once met with a group of young families with small children to hear of their experiences at Mass. They mostly felt greeted and welcomed as they participate at Mass and in other activities. They want their children in church so that they can learn how to place God ahead of all else in their lives beginning with the Mass. They'd like not to feel uncomfortable about that decision. I remember how Archbishop Flynn used to say: "Thank you for having children, and thank you for bringing them to church." I likewise applaud them in this decision!

It may be tempting sometimes to understand the Mass as a form of entertainment, to be observed from afar without any demands placed on us, to be enjoyed according to our own standards of convenience and comfort. If the Mass is a performance, then we would have every reason to object when young children cry or make a disturbance at Mass.

But the Mass is not a performance. Rather it is the total gift of self that Jesus offers to the Father in love and we, as his body, are invited to offer ourselves with him. This offering changes us when we enter into Mass fully, making us one with Christ and in love with our brothers and sisters. We know that even young children are inspired in this way to offer themselves to him as they have made their prayers for their family, their school and their parish known to our Lord.

We might say that very young children are too small to do this because they cannot comprehend the Mass on a natural level. However, they can comprehend the Mass on a supernatural level and will do so all the more when their mothers and fathers bring them to church and so become used to centering their lives on the Sunday Eucharistic experience. As Jesus boldly proclaims several times, "You must acquire the heart of a child in order to enter the kingdom of heaven."

I do agree that if a child is persistently crying or making a disturbance that they should be taken either to the narthex area in back of the church or into the cry room. However, we ought not feel that we need to understand everything in order to receive the grace that the Mass offers and to grow in holiness, but like them to let the Mass move us on a supernatural level.

We are the family of God and our young families want to know that they are included. They want to be affirmed in their choice to go to church and bring their children. They want to know that they are welcome. We can make young families feel more included by personally welcoming them as they enter our "space." Hospitality is empowered by the Holy Spirit. It is understood to be the desire to welcome others, to share one's concern, time, love, personal space, and resources with someone else without expecting anything in return. Yet, ironically, this is when we get the most in return. This is a form of active participation in the liturgy! We need not be afraid of the chaos and being a little distracted here or there as we declare ourselves both a Eucharistic and a pro-life community. "Let the children come to me and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." As we welcome our children to the table of the Lord for the first time, may God bless you and your family.
