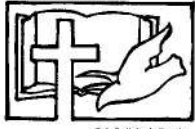

Esta obra relata como un músico llega de noche a la Abadía de Fetero pidiendo posada. Los hermanos del monasterio lo invitaron a pasar la noche. Allí él les contó su vida pecaminosa y su deseo de encontrar un Miserere (Salmo 51) digno de expiar sus pecados ante Dios. Le contaron del Miserere del Monte que cantaban durante la noche los monjes difuntos de un Monasterio que había sido destruido siglos atrás. El músico afanado por encontrar su Miserere, corrió a la montaña donde escuchó aquel lamentoso y bello canto. Al regresar a la Abadía intentó escribir la música de aquel Miserere, pero lo único que logró fue volverse loco.

Aquel pobre hombre murió sin reconocer que cada quien debe entonar a su manera su propio y pobre Miserere mei (piedad de mi). Dios no nos perdona por la belleza o la fuerza de nuestra confesión, sino por su amor y su misericordia.

SOMOS LLAMADOS

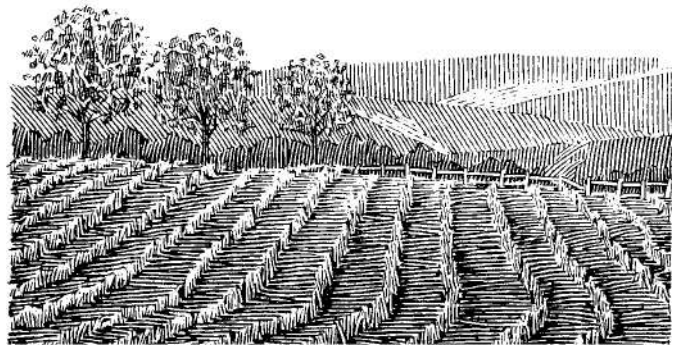
¿Cómo sabemos que Dios nos está llamando? Algunas veces la llamada puede ser muy clara: esto es lo que necesitamos hacer. Otras veces, una llamada puede ser menos obvia, y puede tomar más tiempo discernir esa llamada. Lo que es cierto es que cada uno de nosotros seremos llamados, a horarios diferentes y de diferentes formas, dependiendo de nuestras fortalezas y debilidades.

Mientras que los profetas Isaías y Jeremías fueron llamados en visiones espectaculares, la llamada a Eliseo fue de una forma sencilla y en un evento único: el profeta Elías se acercó a él mientras este araba y "le echó encima su manto" (1 Reyes 19, 19). Eliseo entendió inmediatamente, este fue un signo de que él tenía que seguir a Elías y heredar su manto como profeta.

Estamos familiarizados con el cómo, al principio de su ministerio, Jesús llamó a pescadores para que lo siguieran y cómo ellos dejaron todo para seguirlo. Los eventos en el Evangelio de hoy suceden mucho después, después Jesús había decidido ir a Jerusalén, y Lucas informa al lector, que hay presentimientos acerca de su futuro. Jesús es muy bien conocido que algunas personas se acercan a él y quieren ir con él, pero a ellas se les advierte cuáles serán las dificultades que se presentarán. Otras personas llamadas por Jesús quieren primero despedirse de sus familiares; Jesús se encoge de hombros y sigue sin ellos. La urgencia del trabajo que está adelante exige dedicación total e inmediata.

¿CÓMO PUEDES DECIRLO?

Una de las formas en que el Espíritu está constantemente respirando nueva vida a la Iglesia es en la práctica de la dirección espiritual. Además de nuestra oración personal, los directores espirituales pueden proveer apoyo para el discernimiento del desencadenamiento del Espíritu en nuestras vidas. A los benedictinos, dominicos y jesuitas se les conoce por su trabajo en la dirección espiritual y en la capacitación de otras personas como directores espirituales. Por ahora la Iglesia está bendecida con un número de sacerdotes, monjas y fieles laicos que ayudan a otras personas a discernir y responder con la fortaleza y dedicación requerida para seguir a Jesús, a donde quiera que la misión nos lleve.
