FROM THE PASTOR

Archdiocesan Synod Coming

One of the items discussed at our priest meeting in Rochester last month was the upcoming Archdiocesan Synod. This is a special gathering that has been called by Archbishop Hebda to seek input from the people of the archdiocese to better understand the pastoral needs of our archdiocese and how best to address them. This is a process that will unfold over the next two and a half years with the actual synod involving hundreds of laity and clergy in the Spring of 2021. After the synod, a pastoral letter will be issued by the Archbishop along with implementing follow up actions in the fall of 2021.

Along the way there will be plenty of opportunities, beginning later this summer, for parishioners from throughout the Archdiocese to participate and offer their input. The last time that our Archdiocese held a synod was in 1938, so it is a rare and special opportunity to strengthen our local church. In addition to pastoral planning, the Archbishop is hoping that this process will contribute to the healing of our Archdiocese following the decades long abuse crisis and subsequent Archdiocesan bankruptcy. You will be hearing more about the synod and the process in the days ahead. Please pray for the Holy Spirit to grace this effort that it may prove fruitful in the life of our Archdiocese and our local parish life.

Welcome Fr. Nels Gjengdahl!

We are pleased and so fortunate to share with you that starting July 1st Fr. Nels Gjengdahl will be providing help at occasional Sunday Masses, on an as-needed basis, at Guardian Angels and St. Nicholas. Fr. Gjengdahl grew up in North St. Paul, MN, graduating from North St. Paul High School in 1999. He then attended North Dakota State University to study engineering. While he has been a lifelong Catholic, it was at college where his faith came alive. After two years of studying engineering, Fr. Gjengdahl entered Cardinal Muench Seminary in Fargo, ND, and graduated with a degree in Philosophy in May of 2003. In the fall, he entered the St. Paul Seminary at the University of St. Thomas. He was ordained a priest in 2007 and was appointed parochial vicar at St. Odilia in Shoreview, MN.

Following St. Odilia, Fr. Gjengdahl was assigned as parochial vicar of St. John Neumann in Eagan as well as part-time chaplain at Saint Thomas Academy in Mendota Heights. After one year, his chaplain assignment became full-time. This change allowed him to be both a full-time teacher and a sacramental minister for the school. He taught several subjects including morality, sacraments, Church history, world religions and Catholic social teaching and even coached ultimate frisbee. After a seven-year term as school chaplain, he was assigned as pastor to Nativity of Mary Catholic Church in Bloomington, MN in 2017.

On July 1st, Fr. Gjengdahl moved from his position at Nativity of Mary Catholic Church to providing the Holy Family Catholic High School with full-time sacramental leadership and spiritual guidance. He will teach within theology department, support ongoing campus ministry efforts, and enhance formation opportunities. In addition to Holy Family, he will be helping on Sundays at Sts. Joachim and Anne in Shakopee as well as Guardian Angels in Chaska and St. Nicholas in Carver.

Uno de los temas discutidos en nuestra reunión de sacerdotes en Rochester el mes pasado fue el próximo Sínodo Arquidiocesano. Esta es una reunión especial que ha sido convocada por el arzobispo Hebda para buscar aportes de la gente de la arquidiócesis para comprender mejor las necesidades pastorales de nuestra arquidiócesis y la mejor manera de abordarlas. Este es un proceso que se desarrollará durante los próximos dos años y medio con el sínodo real que involucra a cientos de laicos y clérigos en la primavera de 2021. Después del sínodo, el Arzobispo emitirá una carta pastoral junto con la implementación de acciones de seguimiento en el otoño de 2021. En el camino, habrá muchas oportunidades, a partir de este verano, para que feligreses de toda la Arquidiócesis participen y ofrezcan sus opiniones. La última vez que nuestra Arquidiócesis celebró un sínodo fue en 1938, por lo que es una oportunidad excepcional y especial para fortalecer nuestra iglesia local. Además de la planificación pastoral, el Arzobispo espera que este proceso contribuya a la curación de nuestra Arquidiócesis después de décadas de crisis de abuso y la subsiguiente bancarrota de la Arquidiócesis. Escuchará más sobre el sínodo y el proceso en los próximos días. Oremos para que el Espíritu Santo agradezca este esfuerzo para que pueda ser fructífero en la vida de nuestra Arquidiócesis y en la vida de nuestra parroquia local.

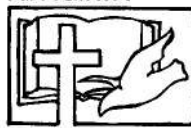
TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

LEY Y ORDEN

¿Alguna vez escuchaste a alguien dar a una persona una dosis de la realidad y haberte dado cuenta que a ti también “te tocaba entender”? En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús está hablando a un sabelotodo que parece estar desafiándolo, intentando ver si Jesús tiene el conocimiento teológico para ser el maestro excepcional del que se dice ser, preguntándole acerca de los que se necesita de la Ley para obtener la vida eterna. Jesús entonces le regresa la pregunta y le pregunta a este experto doctor de la Ley, cómo él puede responder la pregunta. El doctor de la Ley menciona que la respuesta obviamente proviene de la parte de la Ley que menciona amar a Dios y al prójimo. Pero Jesús sigue preguntando, ¿quién es mi prójimo? ¿La Ley da respuesta a esta pregunta?

En el libro del Deuteronomio, Moisés habla a los israelitas acerca de la nueva Ley, los Diez Mandamientos. En tiempos de Jesús, esas “diez” leyes se habían elevado a más de seiscientas, requiriendo que fueran interpretadas para que las personas pudieran ser obedecidas sin trabas por las inevitables inconsistencias de tan gran número de regulaciones. En lugar de la Ley, Jesús responde con una historia de las más famosas de todos los tiempos: el “buen” samaritano. Aquí es donde la trama se complica.
