Chastity at the Heart of the Holy Family

When St. Joseph learned that his betrothed wife to be was with child, one can only imagine how confused, hurt, and saddened he must have been to learn of this troubling reality. Fearing the worst, he decided to call off the marriage, but he sought to do so quietly and without any malice towards her. With his limited awareness of the full circumstances, he knew that he could not, in good conscience, go through with finalizing the marriage. Yet, out of love for her, he still wanted to see her protected from harm. He did not want her to be shamed or treated badly by others in any way. By “law”, he certainly had the “right” to do that and more, but he chose the law of love, and was concerned for her.

The Angel then spoke to him in a dream announcing to him that it was by the Holy Spirit that Mary had conceived and that he should have no hesitation about taking her as his wife. We can easily imagine Mary telling him after the dream, perhaps even with a smile, “I told you so!”

Joseph then did a one-eighty and was obedient to what the Angel had told him. Now he would protect Mary, and the child Jesus for the rest of his life. He would remain chaste with her, honoring her perpetual virginity. He would generously and sacrificially give himself to Mary in every way, except intimately. The concern of a violation of chastity motivated St. Joseph to want to avoid marrying her, and then later, his perfect honoring of her virginity was at the heart of their married life. Chastity is at the heart of the Holy Family, and must also be at the heart of all families in Christ, and all single persons in Christ. In the case of the Holy Family it was complete abstinence. But in our marriage and family life, and single life, it is lived with abstinence outside of marriage, and fidelity within marriage. The many temptations today of pornography, contraception, a hook up mentality, same sex coupling, and engaging in sex in non-procreative ways, all go counter to the chastity modeled by the Holy Family, and taught by Christ. May the example and prayers of the Holy Family lead us all to ever greater fidelity to the perfect chastity that we are called to, each in our vocations to Christ.

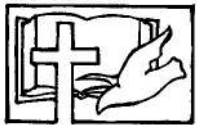
