We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.



Dear parishioners of Guardian Angels,

Hello from the Church of Saint Henry in Monticello! I am in the process of saying goodbye and wrapping things up here so that I can come to be your pastor. It is hard to say goodbye and I have shed some tears, but I assure you that they are tears of gratitude for all the good that God has done and out of the mutual love that we share. I am now looking forward to our new adventure together in Chaska as we go forth on our journey of faith, praying for God's guidance and blessing, and glorifying God in what we do.

I grew up between Big Lake and Elk River and my parents actually live in Monticello, so I'll be able to stop in the parish and say hello or pray once in a while when I see them. I grew up with four sisters and I am the second oldest. As a graduate of Elk River High School in 1986 my first college experience was at the University of Minnesota. I studied Chemical Engineering and earned my Bachelor's degree in 1991. Having met friends at the University who had a positive influence on me for Jesus, I first began to think about some sort of full-time ministry at that point. They were friends who truly lived their faith and their aliveness to God really showed me how it was possible to live a life of faith as an adult.

After college I worked in the field of water treatment for about five years before beginning the seminary in 1996, deciding to give diocesan priesthood a try. After two years at Saint John Vianney minor seminary and four years at The Saint Paul Seminary plus one additional year of internship at a parish. I was ordained a priest in May of 2003. In my seventeen years of priesthood I was assigned for two years as an associate priest at The Church of Saint Bernard in Saint Paul and one and a half years at Saint Francis de Sales and Saint James in Saint Paul. Then, my first assignment as a pastor was for four and a half years at Saint Peter in Richfield. All three of these parishes had Catholic schools and Saint Bernard had Catholic high school and Saint Peter's had Holy Angels high school across the parking lot. I have seen the greatness of being in a Catholic environment during the school day and often thought to myself that "it would have been great for me to have done half of what these kids are doing when I grew up."

Since July 2011 I have been at Saint Henry's and I am really grateful for so many happy memories here of growing in faith and communion with each other. The hard work that we did is so worthwhile and has led me to realize and believe that God really wants to bless his parishes through our efforts. People sometimes ask, "What is your vision for the parish, Father?" That is my vision coming in – that everyone will know and believe that God wants so much to bless His parishes. Again, I look forward to our time together and our growing together in faith in Jesus Christ.



TEN PIEDAD

“Alabado sea el Señor, porque [Dios] ha rescatado la vida de los pobres del poder de los inicuos!” (Jeremías 20:13). Después de la gran recesión de 2008, la clase media se encogió, y las personas que perdieron su trabajo y a menudo sus hogares se hundieron en la pobreza. Esta no es la dirección que deberíamos dirigirnos. Deberíamos estar levantando a los pobres, ayudándoles a mantenerse a flote y construir una vida suficiente para sí mismos: poseer un hogar, alimentar y educar a sus hijos, tener esperanza. Porque esto es lo que Dios quiere para nosotros, para ayudar a nuestros hermanos y hermanas, sin importar su raza, religión, origen nacional, o cualquier otra cosa que los haga “diferentes” de nosotros. Debemos tener piedad. Incluso aquellos que tienen poco son conocidos por compartir lo que tienen con aquellos que tienen menos. ¡Cuánto más deben ayudar los ricos a los que están atrapados! Al cantar en el salmo responsorial de hoy, “Porque el Señor escucha a los pobres, / [los propios] [de Dios] que están en lazos [Dios] no rechazan” (Salmos 69 68:33).

CON TU CONSTANTE AYUDA, OH DIOS

“He escuchado las calumnias de la gente: ‘¡Terror por todas partes!’ ” (Jeremías 20:10). ¿De qué tenemos miedo? ¿Tenemos miedo de las personas que hablan mal de nosotros? ¿De aquellos que curiosean en nuestras vidas? ¿Tenemos miedo de caer en la pobreza? ¿De la guerra en nuestro país? Se dice que aquí en Estados Unidos podemos ser pobres después de una hospitalización y nos llegue la cuenta del hospital; no deberíamos ser tan confiados de nuestros bienes materiales. Nunca sabemos lo que nos puede pasar. Debemos ser misericordiosos con aquellas personas que han caído en la desgracia, y estar listo para ayudar a nuestras hermanas y hermanos, así como Dios tiene misericordia y nos ayuda cuando tropezamos y caemos.

NO TENGAS MIEDO A ALGUIEN

La pobreza existe, así como la muerte existe. ¡Pero no debemos rendirnos o perder esperanza! Pues Dios conoce todas nuestras necesidades y está listo para ayudarnos. “Porque el Señor escucha a los necesitados, y no rechaza a los cautivos (Salmo 69:34). Quizás seamos o no seamos pobres materialmente, pero somos víctimas de nuestra propia tendencia hacia el pecado.

Así como Adán todos murieron, en Cristo todos permanecen vivos. “Pero no hay comparación entre el delito y el don. Porque si por el delito de uno solo todos murieron, mucho más la gracia de Dios, hecha don gratuito en otro hombre, Jesucristo se ha derramado abundantemente sobre todos” (Romanos 5:15). Buscamos a Dios por su misericordia y su consuelo en nuestras necesidades. Dios escucha nuestra oración; y en los escondites secretos de nuestro corazón herido Dios nos consuela y nos ofrece la salvación. “Así pues, no les tengan miedo; porque no hay nada oculto que no vaya a manifestarse, nada secreto que no vaya a saberse. Lo que yo les digo en la oscuridad, díganlo a plena luz; lo que escuchen al oído, proclámenlo desde las azoteas” (Mateo 10:26-27).

Podemos ser pobres materialmente, o tener miedo a ese tipo de pobreza. Todos somos pobres en nuestras faltas, pequeñas o grandes, pero no debemos tener miedo, porque Dios está con nosotros por medio de su misericordia y amor. “No tengan miedo a los que matan el cuerpo, pero no pueden quitar la vida” (Mateo 10:28). En Dios se puede confiar.
