Mass Intentions: Mass intentions may be for the living and/or the departed, with a † designating in the bulletin a deceased person. There is a \$10 suggested donation per Mass intention. Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

FROM THE PASTOR

A Review of our Sacred Liturgy during the Pandemic

Dear parishioners,

With the recent news of spikes in Covid-19 cases and some new things that will take place in our liturgy, I thought that this would be a good time to review how we will be conducting our liturgy together.

Prayer Cards

As we undergo our process of discerning and developing a pastoral plan to address the question of Catholic education in this area, we will begin praying a continuous Novena to the Holy Spirit beginning seven minutes prior to every Mass. Then, we will have a period of silence before Mass begins. We will pray this prayer together at least through the winter.

Regarding touching the prayer cards, the risk of surface contact infection is low. Nevertheless, as a general rule of thumb, viruses can live on plastic for up to three days and paper for up to one day. Because the prayer cards will be a frequently touched item (under 24 hours), we will laminate them, even though this will create a plastic-type surface. This will make them cleanable. Those who will clean the pews, please incorporate the cleaning of prayer cards into your routine of cleaning. Thank you. And remember, please wash your hands frequently as we all touch many frequently contacted surfaces throughout our daily lives.

Money Collection

Using long-handled baskets, we will conduct a collection at each Mass. Rather than having the priest or deacon receive the collection at the offertory, it will be placed at the side altar at the left of the sanctuary. We are now beginning a fund to address larger-scale building maintenance needs. We will take up a second collection immediately following the first regular collection every third Sunday of a month, beginning today.

Wearing Masks

Since July, our governor has required masks to be worn in public places. Though decisions regarding safety protocols within Catholic churches are ultimately within the authority of the diocesan bishop, our Archbishop has asked us to comply with this executive order. Catholic tradition teaches that the Church should collaborate with public health officials for the common good unless directives are unreasonable, impractical or discriminatory.

Liturgical ministers are exempt from the order when conducting their ministries. Face masks should not be used by children under the age of two. Persons with certain respiratory conditions for whom wearing a mask poses a greater health risk than not wearing one are exempt and should not wear a mask. Face shields are less effective and should not be worn as a perceived convenient alternative to masks. Particles can flow freely underneath a face shield. Therefore, a face shield can protect you from others, but do not protect others from you.

Receiving Holy Communion

Communion in the hand is strongly recommended because this method of receiving greatly lessens the effects of the recipient's

breath on the minister. Receiving communion in the hand is an acceptable and laudable practice in this time of emergency. The Archbishop wants us to receive holy communion in the hand and I as your pastor do as well. Nevertheless, those receiving holy communion on the tongue, please come to my line and be last to receive. I will use hand sanitizer after every communicant who receives on the tongue.

All communicants, please form one single line, not a double line and maintain six feet of distance between you and a person of another household. For those sitting in the center sections, this will require yielding to the person across from you who is entering the line. For those on the side sections, please proceed around the back of church in order to re-enter your pew. The priest or Eucharistic Minister will come to those who have mobility issues.

Thank you very much for all of your cooperation with these measures and let's pray for an end to the pandemic and for those who have suffered from it or are suffering from it now. Our Lady of Good Health, pray for us!

[Immediately the one who received five talents went and traded with them, and made another five. Likewise, the one who received two made another two.
