Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

FROM THE PASTOR



The Baptism of Our Lord

For centuries the Church has linked the Baptism of the Lord as part of the Christmas season. At Christmas, God accepts human nature and this is revealed to the shepherds. At the Epiphany, the wise men realized that he was the promised Messiah. Now, we celebrate an event that happened some 30 years later. Why would Jesus be baptized by John the Baptist? And why do we link this event with Christmas? This was the fullest, most striking revelation of Jesus as the Messiah because we see the abundant, infinite, gentle, abiding love of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. I would have loved to have been John the Baptist at that moment in which he saw the dove and heard the voice of God.

In this act of Baptism we see the humility of God. John the Baptist was calling people to conversion and penitence and the external sign of this was immersion in the water of the Jordan, an act and a symbol of cleansing. John was trying to prepare people for the coming of the Messiah. He called the coming Savior someone "mightier than I" and saw himself as merely his servant. John's surprise must have been great when he saw Jesus coming among the people to receive the baptism of repentance. What did this mean? John received an answer from heaven that Jesus' attitude was pleasing to the Father and that in doing this Jesus was showing himself to be God's "beloved son".

Jesus, in being baptized, showed his solidarity with us. He shows no aversion to me, to my failings or my mistakes. He would take on his shoulders the burden of the sins of all humanity. We see the harmony within the Trinity as Jesus submitted himself to the Father's loving plan. We see Jesus dying to himself, taking on our sins so that we might be in communion with him again. Therefore, we see ourselves being drawn into loving communion with the Trinity. We are to be participants in the very life of God! Let us rise out of the waters with Jesus to new life. Let us live out our baptism which is a baptism into the very life of God!

Dear Parishioners and Catholic School families,

As you may have heard at Mass or seen in the parish bulletin, we have been asked by Archbishop Hebda to help create a comprehensive pastoral plan for Catholic education in the Chaska and Carver area.

First, it is important to note that Catholic education encompasses many ministries: Catholic school; children's faith formation; youth ministry; family faith formation and adult faith formation.

Our goal is to discuss and discern the best way to provide Catholic education in our area, while being good stewards of our resources and living out our mission effectively. This discussion and discernment will include whether or not we can and ought to continue to operate our parish school beyond this school year.

To this end, we are holding three town hall-style meetings in different formats on different dates in January to engage with as many parish and school community members as possible. We don't want the pandemic to prevent engagement, so we are offering online options for participation, and multiple ways to collect input. We will hold a Spanish language session at some point in January.

Please note that while each meeting is presented via different means, the topics addressed at each meeting will be the same. I invite you attend one of these meetings and to share your input during and/or after the meeting by using the enclosed town hall input form or by sharing your input via an electronic version of the same form posted on the parish website. Below are the meeting dates, times and online or physical locations.

- January 9 from 1-2:45 p.m. live stream of meeting you will be able to find this live stream and a recording of it later at the same place you find Mass live streams on the parish website
- **January 16 from 1-2:45 p.m. Zoom meeting** you will be able to find a link to this Zoom meeting on the parish website, we will also email this Zoom link to Catholic school families
- January 23 from 1-2:45 p.m. in-person meeting in Saint Francis Hall we will space tables and chairs to allow for safe social distancing and require that masks be worn throughout the meeting

In addition to using the town hall input form, during the meetings on January 16th and 23rd, you will have the opportunity to ask questions and share comments. I encourage you to prepare yourself before attending a meeting by reading the following resources. Links to these resources may be found on the parish website.




