Mass Intentions: Mass intentions may be for the living and/or the departed, with a † designating in the bulletin a deceased person. There is a \$10 suggested donation per Mass intention. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

**Gospel Reflection, 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time, Year B
Samuel 3: 3b-10, 19; 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20; John 1: 35-42**

What Are You Looking For?

In our gospel Jesus asks us a breathtaking question, “What are you looking for?” These words call us to search our desires. Jesus is drawing us to himself through the longings of our heart. No matter what we are doing, we are looking for Christ. The Lord once said to Saint Catherine of Siena, “I who am infinite God want you to serve me with what is infinite, and you have nothing infinite except your soul’s love and desire.” “You are not your own.” God’s law is God’s desire and it has been placed within our heart. To do his will is our delight. To remain in communion with him is that which satisfies our deepest longings. Saint Paul gives us insight into this in a specific way that pertains to our world today. “The body is not for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body.” He continues, “Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person commits a sin against his own body.” In today’s world of

modern communications a tidal wave has come – the tidal wave of pornography. Through electronic communication, never before has pornography been so available. A study between 2009 and 2010 involving 400 million websites concluded that 13% of all searches were for erotic content. A 2014 study by the Barna Group concluded that 79% of 18-30 year-old men view pornography at least once per month. For women ages 18-30, the figure is 63%. Percentages decrease only moderately for older age groups. This is distressing when we consider the effect that this has on relationships and how we view each other. To view pornography is to settle for a poor parody of intimacy that objectifies another and leads to break up of marriages and inability to connect in real ways with others. In 2002 the American Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers found that 56% of all divorce cases involved one spouse having “an obsessive interest in pornographic websites.”

What do I recommend? First of all, confession. Come and receive the mercy of God. Admit that this pathway was the wrong one and that it is time to respond to the question of Jesus, “What are you looking for?” by following Him. Second, I recommend reclaimsexualhealth.com. This website, sponsored by the Diocese of Green Bay, has helped many people overcome sexual addiction. This is hard to overcome because it is scientifically proved that it works like an addiction. Our brains form habits so that it becomes easier to do routine things. It is the way we are wired. However, we can retrain our minds to shrink the influence of old habits and re-form good habits that truly help us not only avoid pornography, but build and commit to healthy relationships while doing healthy activities that truly help us grow as persons. May God bless us as we navigate our way in this new world of electronic communication.

St. Nicholas Parishioners,

The Archbishop asked for our input regarding the future of St. Nicholas Catholic Church and parish. I am pleased to tell you that on Wednesday, Dec 30, I delivered our recommendation to the Archbishop.

We followed a process where together we prayed, worshipped, and discerned how best to fulfill the request made of us. Using U.S. Mail, we invited input from all the “Registered and Active” households. We also posted the survey invitation in the bulletin, on the parish webpage, and Facebook page. And lastly, we put out yard signs directing people to the web page and used a QR Code for easy access. These efforts resulted in receiving input from more than 160 households. A dedicated group of more than 20 parishioners met multiple times to help interpret the data and form the recommendation. If you wish to see the full recommendation, 111 pages in seven sections, please contact me to arrange a date & time to meet in the parish office. Once we hear from the Archbishop, I will be sure to share that with you.

St. Nicholas continues to operate with Fr. Tollefson as the Parochial Administrator and me as the Parish Life Administrator. I ask for your continuing prayers and support for St. Nicholas Parish. The Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

Reading 1

1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day.

It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.

Evangelio

Jn 1, 35-42

En aquel tiempo, estaba Juan el Bautista con dos de sus discípulos, y fijando los ojos en Jesús, que pasaba, dijo: “Éste es el Cordero de Dios”. Los dos discípulos, al oír estas palabras, siguieron a Jesús. Él se volvió hacia ellos, y viendo que lo seguían, les preguntó: “¿Qué buscan?” Ellos le contestaron: “¿Dónde vives, Rabí?” (Rabí significa ‘maestro’). Él les dijo: “Vengan a ver”.

Fueron, pues, vieron dónde vivía y se quedaron con él ese día. Eran como las cuatro de la tarde. Andrés, hermano de Simón Pedro, era uno de los dos que oyeron lo que Juan el Bautista decía y siguieron a Jesús. El primero a quien encontró Andrés, fue a su hermano Simón, y le dijo: “Hemos encontrado al Mesías” (que quiere decir ‘el Ungido’). Lo llevó a donde estaba Jesús y éste, fijando en él la mirada, le dijo: “Tú eres Simón, hijo de Juan. Tú te llamarás Kefás” (que significa Pedro, es decir ‘roca’).

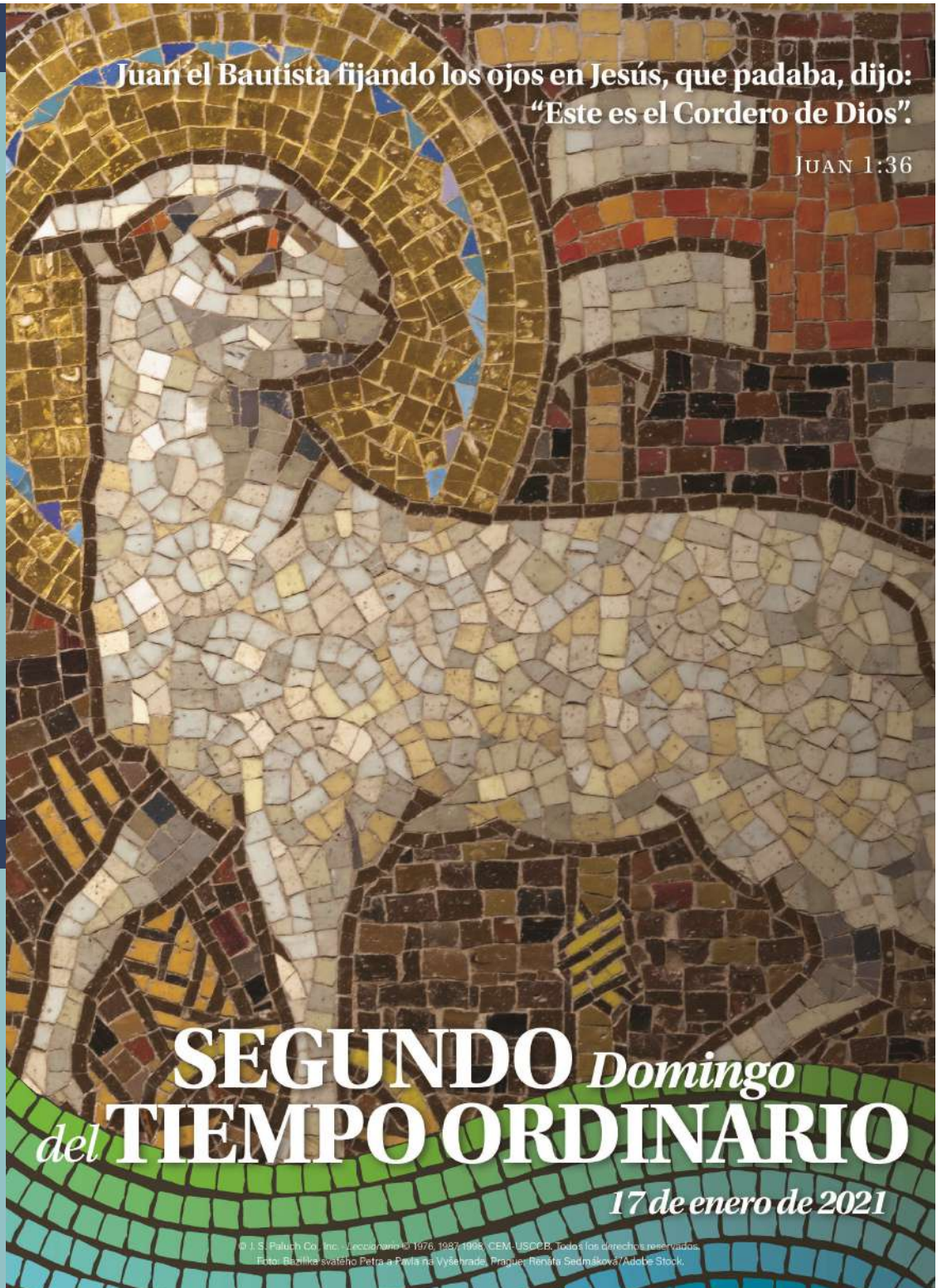
