## FROM THE PASTOR

### Life Is Always a Gift

At this time of year, we celebrate the gift of life and remember especially that every life is a great gift. Yet, we know that very high rates of abortion exist of unborn children who are diagnosed in the womb as having a disability. Though reliable data is scarce, the best calculations suggest that 67% of U.S. pregnancies where it is suggested the baby would be born with Down syndrome end in abortion. Our faith tells us, however, that, if we place our trust in the Lord, we will find happiness even as we give ourselves most generously to raising such a child.

Many parents faced with such a difficult diagnosis are afraid that their child will suffer needlessly if the pregnancy is brought to term. However, other studies show high levels of happiness for these children and their parents. Dr. Brian Skotko, Director of the Down Syndrome program at Massachusetts General Hospital conducted a study that revealed that 99% of children with Down Syndrome report living happy lives, 99% of parents love their child, and 97% of those with Down Syndrome like who they are.

The Kennedy – Brownback amendment of 2008 was passed in order to deliver accurate, peer-reviewed information to parents when their child in the womb is diagnosed with a disability in order to counter any untrue information being given them. However, it was never funded and this increases the need for state-level action which has been either passed or is in process in six different states. This action by each of these states is their own version of the Down Syndrome Information Act.

Still even parents with a pro-life perspective often find it devastating when they receive a diagnosis of a disability for their child. In 1995 Annalise LaHood founded Isaiah's Promise, a Washington DC area group who offers peer support for these parents. The goal, she says, is to help parents accept the baby they have been given rather than the baby they thought they had. They are concerned about the suffering of the child themselves, what it will be like to carry the child to term knowing that they may die, and how they will care for the child. Yet, she says, every parent served who had a child diagnosed with a disability has not regretted their decision to carry their child to term.

Let us pray for these children, for these families, for trust in God's plan, for generosity, for doctors and nurses to practice pro-life medicine, and for the faith to live by God's design even when called to walk with God in a very, very close way. May our creator bless us all.

preguntaban: “¿Qué es esto? ¿Qué nueva doctrina es ésta? Este hombre tiene autoridad para mandar hasta a los espíritus inmundos y lo obedecen”. Y muy pronto se extendió su fama por toda Galilea.
