**Communion for the Homebound:** When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

**Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits:** Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

## FROM THE PASTOR

### *The Mercy We Proclaim*

Imagine living 2000 years ago and worshipping in the Jewish Temple and every morning that you pass by, you see a crippled beggar at the gate begging for money because he could not work. The people had become used to seeing this man there and they strongly associated sickness with punishment for sin. Therefore, they were accustomed to seeing him as a sinner. Peter and John, however, cured the beggar and he stood up and started jumping around and praising God. Since the crippled man's former condition was so strongly associated with sin, they saw forgiveness right before their eyes. The sin that caused the crippled condition was erased and Peter proclaimed this as a sign of God's forgiveness in our reading from the Acts of the Apostles today. He proclaimed forgiveness of sin through Jesus Christ.

For our sins to be wiped away means that they are gone and that they no longer exist. This was the reality that the disciples of Jesus and the women experienced when he began to appear many times before them. They were anxious and had questions, but Jesus said, "Peace be with you."

At every Eucharist we meet the risen Lord along the road of our lives. We come to recognize him in the scriptures and in the breaking of the bread. We are meant to live in this Easter reality as an Easter people like those whose questions were relieved by his risen presence among them.

To be an Easter people, we live and speak forgiveness. Easter believers come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation recognizing their own need for forgiveness and placing their hope squarely in the Divine Healer in order to find it. In families, they are the parents who take back their prodigal children, or they are the ones who stay in touch with the family member who the rest of the family has cut off. They are the adult children who forgive the shortcomings of their parents and take care of them in their declining years. They are the family member who prepares special holiday or birthday meals hoping that a family that shares stories and shares a meal together will enjoy laughter and forgiven one another of the small and large offenses that family members can inflict on each other.

**As we come to his table, we recognize that he offers us the same possibility to get up, to have our sins wiped away, and be messengers of this same Good News.**

# We are Beginning a New Parish Pastoral Council!

Dear Parishioners,

We are accepting nominations for the parish pastoral council. Please fill out a slip in the pews with the name of someone who you believe would carry out this role well and drop it in the basket on one of the back tables or at the office. Thanks!

What is the role of the council? The Decree on the Apostolate of the Laity of Vatican II states, “The laity should develop the habit of working in the parish in close union with their priests, of bringing before the ecclesial community their own problems, world problems, and questions regarding man’s salvation, to examine them together and solve them by general discussion.”

The pastor seeks your lived-out wisdom and wants to be one with you. He seeks the wisdom of those who have been members of Guardian Angels for a long time or a short time as each have their own valuable perspectives. When we do this, I definitely believe that I, together with you, can more easily do things and make decisions that truly resonate with parishioners and meet their practical and spiritual needs. This planned and “pastoral” response is discerned more slowly than on a day-to-day basis that goes beyond mere managing or utilizing the expertise of a staff member.

Another important aspect of the parish pastoral council, I believe, is to be keepers of the parish mission. A good council might ask, “Is it time to renew a vision of how to accomplish our stated mission?” “How well are we accomplishing it.” “What can we do to promote it and help it to be accomplished?”

What is the time commitment, you might ask? Each council member would attend a council meeting once per month. They would also possibly call a particular committee leader to ask how their work is going and how the council could help. Or they might attend that committee’s meeting and report back to the council later. Therefore, the commitment is about two to, at most, four hours per month. That is it!

I have heard quite often from council members that they have learned so much about their parish as they have carried out this role. Below is a list of requirements and desired characteristics of a council member:

Is a registered member of Guardian Angels who is in good standing with the Catholic Church.

Has a desire to see the parish grow and the mission flourish.

Desires to actively participate in planning meetings and various parish activities.

Has a willingness to take on this leadership role in the parish.

Is able to attend council meetings each month in order to enable the council to do its work.

Has a desire to make a difference on behalf of the parish by helping to discern how long-range goals and objectives will be best accomplished so that the parish mission may flourish.

Has a willingness to hear various points of view allowing for the effective participation of all in order to arrive at effective recommendations.

I would like to have nine council members on our council. Each member would serve a three-year term with the possibility of one renewable term. We would most likely meet on a Tuesday evening. Thanks so much for considering this all-important role in our parish!

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, “Peace be with you.” But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, “Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have.” And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, “Have you anything here to eat?” They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.

He said to them, “These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled.” Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, “Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.”


