

We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.



FROM THE PASTOR



We Will Begin a New Faith Formation Program!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This coming autumn, we will begin our Encounter Family Faith Formation program. Each Wednesday that we meet, we will come for a time of hospitality and fellowship, teaching and reflections, and worship and prayer. For parents and anyone

else who would like to join, we will have large group teaching with discussion with 8-10 fellow parishioners by tables led by a trained table leader. But this is not all that we will do. We will have moments of worship, prayer, and sharing testimony of where we have found the presence of Jesus in our lives.

You might be asking questions like, "Why do I as a parent need to come?" or Why should we have the elements you are describing when we get that at Mass?" Jesus is the basis and foundation of our teaching! We start with Him. We start with his passion, death, and resurrection for each of us. We start with His personal love for us in each moment of our daily lives. When we start with Him as our personal foundation, only then do the teachings we learn begin to make sense and help our lives build toward sanctity.

However, if we start with doctrine as our foundation and just assume that we all know Him and everything in our lives is fine with Him and barely mention Him or call Him to mind in any worship, then our doctrine will not form a secure foundation. It will begin to stagger under the weight of other doctrines and voices and pressures that are so prevalent in our lives and our society.

Our encounter of Christ together will be aimed primarily at helping parents in their role as primary educators of their children with the special grace as parents that God has given them. We will start with this confidence that God will help us greatly to do that which He has called us to do, even with all of the challenges of today. At the same time, we believe that this experience of encountering Jesus together with a whole community will be beneficial for any adult parishioner who wants to join in at a table.

We will meet at the same time as this current year, 6:15-7:30 PM. Children and youth will go to their respective classes where trained catechists will utilize the Faith and Life Series in their teaching for $1^{st} - 8^{th}$ grade. For Confirmation which normally begins in 9^{th} grade and goes for two years, we will use the Chosen series by Ascension Press to guide discussion in small groups with trained group leaders.

Meanwhile English-speaking parents and other adults will go to one large group gathering at individual tables and Spanish speaking parents and other adults will do likewise in another location. We really look forward to this time in the belief that God will do amazing things and bless our efforts. However, we need many volunteer ministers, including table leaders, catechists, small group leaders for Confirmation, hospitality ministers, hall monitors, and youth activity and service project helpers and leaders for non-Wednesday evening youth activity.

May God bless our efforts and I wish you a continued happy Easter season!


