

We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

FROM THE PASTOR

Take a Great Vacation!

Dear Parishioners,

On this Corpus Christi Sunday, I want to offer three points of reflection on what it means to come to church regularly every Sunday and how this leads to good stewardship as well. I know that we are still in a time of pandemic and the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is lifted for that reason.

However, I have always found the Sunday morning part of my vacations at the nearest local church to be a very important part of finding the renewed grace that leads us again to God. It is a wonderful way to rediscover the universality of the church and the unity we have in our Catholic faith. When we experience the universal church in Cathodrals to small country parishes, we realize how unified we are in Christ. It really is an important part of our re-creation that is such a grace that leads us to give thanks and to find new peace with God.

While all of this is important, it is most important that we do not take a break from receiving the Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ. The experience of Church is not like a school year in which there is summer break. We need Jesus always! We need Him in the ebbs of life and the flows of life. He is the one constant in our whole lives. We have been baptized into His grace and He will be with us on the last day of our lives. The Holy Eucharist marks the passage of our days always.

Second, please offer a planned financial gift at the church you visit. I find a great sense of freedom in simply viewing my financial contribution at the church I visit as part of my vacation cost. See your Sunday morning experience as an integral part of your vacation that has a cost like everything else. If you are getting back in order to go on Sunday evening, let that be part of your vacation experience as well. Taking this approach frees us up to support that parish that is often in an area that depends on dollars from tourism. The churches in these areas are really no different from the local businesses in that they depend on your gift to cover for the off-season times in a very rural area.

Third, please continue to offer your regular gift to Guardian Angels. Regarding financial contributions, there is often the sentiment that, "Oh, well, it's summer." But this reflects a casual custody of our church and our parish. You are the Church and you decide whether we will make our budget. Keeping a regular contribution going enables us to make our budgeted income and have the programs that we intend to have at Guardian Angels.

I offer one final point. In terms of Sunday Mass attendance, please plan ahead. Talk to your relatives, especially if they do not go to Church to make sure that they understand that you expect Mass attendance to be part of your vacation. I know that this can be difficult and it is a sensitive topic, especially if you are dependent on a ride from them. But this is where we are called to witness our faith. We don't have to argue. Simply tell them that part of your upcoming recreation that you would like is to recreate your friendship with God. If they get mad or laugh, give the reason for your hope in one minute or less (see 1 Peter 3:15). Write down what you will say. Let God give you the strength. But, please, please, have the conversation ahead of time. Masstimes.org is a great resource for planning exactly Which Mass at a specific church that you will attend. Also, dialing 411 and asking for "any Catholic Church" in the nearest town will actually prove effective in obtaining the phone number of that church. Often, when you call the phone number for that church, you will hear a voice message with the Mass times listed. May these summer months be a great blessing for you and your family!

Brothers and sisters:

When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God.

For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

CURSILLO IS COMING TO GA IN JUNE & JULY WHAT IS A CURSILLO WEEKEND?

The Cursillo Movement is introduced over a consecutive seventy-two-hour period called a "Three Day Weekend." During the three-day weekend, which begins Thursday evening and ends Sunday evening, a team of religious and lay personnel present a series of talks to the candidates and the entire group calls upon the Holy Spirit for enlightenment and guidance. The team and candidates live as a small Christian community over the weekend and discuss these talks in small groups. The discussions provide an opportunity to share insights about the presentations and hear how others received that same presentation. The talks and discussions cover a variety of topics including:

- The layperson's role within the Church
- Meaning of grace and sacraments
- Importance of prayer and the study of God
- Christian leadership and living Christianity in community.
- Our call to bring Christ to others and transform the very environments in which we live.
- The importance of supporting one another in our live a truly Christian life.

Throughout the weekend the participants will pray together, attend daily mass, and have an opportunity to receive the sacrament of reconciliation. Typically, by the end of the weekend, candidates have a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and a better understanding of the power of the Holy Spirit. Also, candidates leave the weekend knowing that they have been called to spread the Word of God.

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
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
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
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Lecturas de Domingo 6 de Junio de 2021

Solemnidad del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo

Primera lectura

Ex 24, 3-8


