## From The Pastor

### The Bread that Sustains Us on our Liberating Journey

Our gospel reading today is part of that great dialogue between Jesus and the crowd in the 6<sup>th</sup> chapter of John about the bread of life. It is typical in John's gospel that, after Jesus performs a miracle, he enters into a dialogue, whether with some Pharisees or, as we see today, the crowds. This is Saint John's way of drawing out the deeper meaning of the sign that Jesus has performed. In this case, the sign is the multiplication of loaves and fishes that he had performed just before this gospel.

Jesus says something very interesting and profound. "Do not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of man will give you." What is this work? What does it look like? I suggest to you that it is the work of liberation that allows us to come to Him and receive Him, so that we will never hunger and never thirst. Our first reading really gives us great insight into this. The Israelites were just liberated from slavery. And what do they begin to do? They grumble and they complain. They say, "at least in Egypt we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread.": They would rather go back to their slavery. And we do this all of the time. We often tell ourselves that at least our own slavery is familiar. We know our way around it.

The alcoholic says, "How I long to go back to my friends at the bar and have a drink!" I know that was destroying my life and I resolved not to go back to that, but at least then I was somewhat happy. At least then I felt good."

The road to liberation is always difficult, long and painful at times. And when we choose liberation from sin, you always enter a desert, where it is not the way you are used to, and not the way it used to be. Every sin is like an addiction – pride, anger, lust and the road to healing always leads through a desert.

But what did God do? God sent manna from heaven. He gave bread that would sustain them through the desert time. Yes they wanted to go back to slavery. Yes, they were on the journey to the Promised Land, but they doubted it. But in the time in between, the manna sustained them on the journey to liberation. Our Eucharist today, the bread of life that is Jesus himself, sustains us on our journey to liberation.

Jesus said, "Do not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life." What is eternal life? Pure spiritual liberation and pure communion with the person of Jesus Christ. Do not waste your time on longing to go back to the fleshpots of Egypt, but come and eat the bread of life that will sustain you on that road.

**Reading 1**

Ex 16:2-4, 12-15

The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, "Would that we had died at the LORD's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread! But you had to lead us into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!" Then the LORD said to Moses, "I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not. "I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the LORD, am your God." In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, "What is this?" for they did not know what it was. But Moses told them, "This is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat."

Jesus answered them and said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled. Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him the Father, God, has set his seal." So they said to him, "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in the one he sent." So they said to him, "What sign can you do, that we may see and believe in you? What can you do? Our ancestors ate manna in the desert, as it is written: *He gave them bread from heaven to eat.*" So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.



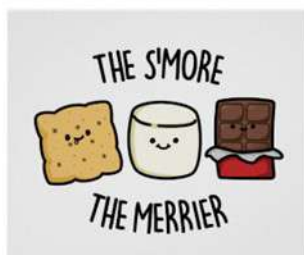


