



### From The Pastor

### **Our Mass Strengthens Our Faith**

The people of Galilee began to grumble about Jesus. They were so excited about The Miracle of the Loaves and Fishes that they had just witnessed. They wanted to make Jesus their king who would lead them to their longed-for liberation from Roman rule. But Jesus had another end in mind. He intended to give not merely bread for bodily hunger, but another kind of food. This food he called "bread from heaven". Our daily bread is necessary, but it is not enough. We need food for our souls. When love is lacking, and a meaning in life and hope is as well, then we face spiritual ruin.

That was not the reason why the people were protesting in Capernaum. Rather, it was because Jesus said that he himself was this "bread from heaven". He was "the bread of life", he said. So Jesus was saying that he is the food that man needs in order to avoid withering away spiritually. How can any man say about himself that he is to some extent "spiritually necessary"? Many false teachers and dictators have come and gone, saying that they were bringers of salvation.

After all, "Jesus is just a man." This was how they reacted. They did not want to be taken in by a self-appointed messenger of salvation. Jesus did not immediately condemn this skepticism and reticence. Rather, he said effectively, "Coming to me, believing in me, is possible only if God is leading someone to me in his heart." Faith is a gift. Believing in Jesus is something that goes beyond our understanding. Yet it is not foolish and irrational. We have experienced belief in Jesus.

When we come to Mass together and let our voices rise to heaven, resoundingly, and when we come and prepare ourselves to receive whatever the Lord can reveal to us that day, and when we process forward as one to receive him, then we can say together, "Yes, that is really how it is. Jesus is indeed the bread of life!

### Saint Nicholas Meeting with the Archbishop Recap

We had a very positive meeting with the Archbishop on Thursday evening, July 29<sup>th</sup> with the parishioners of Saint Nicholas. The Archbishop thanked everyone for their considerable efforts in their discernment of the future of the parish. He then spoke of a future for the parish of serving and reaching out to those who live in new housing in the Carver area and have recently moved here. He also said that he could not imagine that the facility or church in Carver could eventually meet the needs of the people who live in the area. Many spoke of the need, if the parish is to be viable, for a consistent Sunday Mass and the Archbishop agreed that a Sunday Mass with a consistent priest is necessary. It was agreed that this Sunday Mass should be in addition to the Guardian Angels schedule and that a consistent visiting priest should help, me, Father Tony, to celebrate these Masses. It was also agreed that one daily Mass should be added as a replacement of a daily Mass at Guardian Angels. The Sunday Mass in Carver will very likely mean that our Sunday morning Mass schedule at Guardian Angels will change. I have already spoken to parishioners who attended our 10:00 AM Mass about this in a preliminary way. I will follow up with the parishioners of Saint Nicholas as the next step in the process to determine what our Sunday Mass schedule will be. I am very grateful for the Archbishop's direction and visit as I am sure that those who attended are as well. I will continue to provide updates regarding our Mass schedule. Thank you.

### Reflections on the Mass by Bishop Cozzens

Dear Parishioners,

Additionally we provide some reflections here below: What is the purpose of the Sunday obligation?

God gave his people the gift of the Sabbath (Saturday evening – Sunday), and in the Third Commandment instructed for our wellbeing that we keep it holy. For more on this, read five reasons why attending Mass weekly is essential to our faith at archspm.org/5reasons.

The dispensation is being lifted July 1, 2021. What does that mean?

The Sunday obligation to attend Mass in person was temporarily lifted during the pandemic out of concern for the safety of our most vulnerable. As the pandemic subsides, and public gathering restrictions and safety protocols are lifted, it is time to gather as the Body of Christ once again. Therefore, the bishops and diocesan administrators of the Minnesota Catholic Conference decided to reinstate the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation beginning July 1, 2021.

Does this mean there will no longer be any dispensation from the Sunday and Holy Day obligations?

There remains reasons why a Catholic have a dispensation from the Sunday obligation, including when he or she is ill or serving as caretaker for one who cannot attend Mass. Find further examples in the letter from the Minnesota bishops about the return of the Sunday obligation (letter found at archspm.org/mccmassletter).

The faithful who do not attend Mass in person are asked to find a Mass on TV, the radio or online and make a Spiritual Communion (found at <u>archspm.org/spiritualcommunion</u>). Where that is not an option, it would be appropriate to pray the Liturgy of the Hours or the Rosary.

If I can work from home, why can't I worship from home?

It is powerful when we come together to pray. Jesus tells us, "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (Matthew 18:20) Certainly, we can pray anywhere; the Lord invites us to relationship with Him. But there is something extra special about coming together in worship on the Sabbath (Saturday evening-Sunday) in the sanctuary. St. John Chrysostom said, "You cannot pray at home as at church, where there is a great multitude, where exclamations are cried out to God as from one great heart, and where there is something more: the union of minds, the accord of souls, the bond of charity, the prayers of the priests" (CCC 2179).

Why is receiving Communion vital to the Catholic faith?

Holy Communion is "the source and summit of the Christian Life." (CCC 1324). The Apostles and earliest Christian communities joined in community for celebration of the Eucharist. In the Acts of the Apostles, we read, "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers" (Acts 2:42). St. Paul also refers to the celebration of communion, writing, "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" (1 Corinthians 10:16).

Jesus chose such a moment to reveal his identity soon after the resurrection, following his journey alongside two travelers on the road to Emmaus: "And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight... Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of the bread" (Luke 24: 30-31, 35).

How are parishes keeping us safe when we attend Mass?

Parishes follow stringent cleaning protocols, and some still offer sections or Masses with distancing, mask requirements or other COVID-19 protocols. Find the latest liturgical protocols from the archdiocesan Office of Worship at archspm.org/liturgicalprotocols. Find a parish offering COVID-19 precautions by using the Advanced Search tool at archspm.org/locations.

If I've been worshipping from home for over a year, why should I go back now?

Since resuming public worship in May 2020, parishes have taken great care to ensure safety protocols are followed by staff, as well as Mass-goers. With the rise in percentage of the population vaccinated, cases are decreasing and we are starting to see the light at the end of the pandemic tunnel. For these reasons and more, Gov. Walz announced in Executive Order 21-21 that social distancing is no longer mandated indoors as of May 28, 2021, meaning parishes may now open at full capacity. Parishes stand ready and eager to welcome back the faithful for in-person worship.


### **Lecturas De Hoy**
