

Mass Intentions: Mass intentions may be for the living and/or the departed, with a † designating in the bulletin a deceased person. There is a \$10 suggested donation per Mass intention. Baptism: Our Baptism Belonging Class is required for all parents as a first step to Baptism of your child. We encourage Godparents to attend. The Belonging Class is held once per month after the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Please call the Parish Office to sign up for the class. Baptism dates will be given at the class. Special dates requested will be considered and accommodated depending on circumstances.

Reconciliation: Saturdays at 3:15—4:15 p.m. or by appointment.

Matrimony: Marriage preparation is required. Please call Father Tony VanderLoop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 at least eight months in advance.

Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

From The Pastor

Father Dvorak to Help at Guardian Angels and Saint Nicholas

Dear Parishioners of Guardian Angels and Saint Nicholas,

As you probably know, I was assigned by Archbishop Hebda this past July 1st to be the pastor at Saint Nicholas in addition to being pastor at Guardian Angels. Saint Nicholas in Carver has been undergoing a discernment process for the past year as Guardian Angels was discerning the future of its Catholic education.

On July 29th, Archbishop Hebda met with the parishioners of Saint Nicholas and me and thanked the people for their participation in the discernment process. This process was led with the outstanding leadership and guidance of Deacon Jim Bauhs, who has now become the deacon at The Church of Saint Michael in Farmington. The Archbishop said that, with the new growth in housing in Carver, he wants to keep Saint Nicholas open and find ways to reach out to the people there.

It was agreed that in order to make Saint Nicholas viable, it is time to bring back the Mass. We all agreed that there is to be one Sunday Mass in addition to my schedule at Guardian Angels and one daily Mass in replacement of one daily Mass at Guardian Angels.

After some recent discernment with you the parishioners, I have determined that we will go with the following Sunday Mass schedule at both churches:

8:00 a.m.
10:00 a.m.
12:30 p.m. Spanish

Sunday Mass at Saint Nicholas

10:00 a.m.

This means that we will receive the help of Father Jim Dvorak, who has graciously agreed to help us, particularly at the 10:00 a.m. Masses. I have not determined the exact schedule in terms of which of us will celebrate at each respective parish, but you will see Father Dvorak on a regular basis. Father Dvorak has recently retired from being pastor at Immaculate Conception in Watertown. Now he is beginning a new chapter in the Jordan area. Please join me in welcoming him!

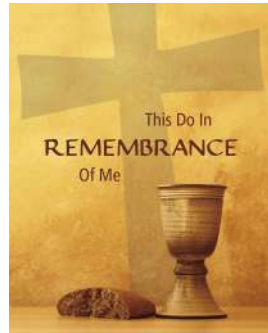

Gospel

Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace, they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. — So, the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?" He responded, "Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: *This people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts.* You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition. "He summoned the crowd again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. "From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within, and they defile."



Dt 4, 1-2. 6-8

Hermanos: Todo beneficio y todo don perfecto viene de lo alto, del creador de la luz, en quien no hay ni cambios ni sombras. Por su propia voluntad nos engendró por medio del Evangelio para que fuéramos, en cierto modo, primicias de sus creaturas. Evangelio

Mc 7, 1-8. 14-15. 21-23

En aquel tiempo, se acercaron a Jesús los fariseos y algunos escribas venidos de Jerusalén. Viendo que algunos de los discípulos de Jesús comían con las manos impuras, es decir, sin habérselas lavado, los fariseos y los escribas le preguntaron: "¿Por qué tus discípulos comen con manos impuras y no siguen la tradición de nuestros mayores?" (Los fariseos y los judíos, en general, no comen sin lavarse antes las manos hasta el codo, siguiendo la tradición de sus mayores; al volver del mercado, no comen sin hacer primero las abluciones, y observan muchas otras cosas por tradición, como purificar los vasos, las jarras y las ollas). Jesús les contestó: "¡Qué bien profetizó Isaías sobre ustedes, hipócritas, cuando escribió: *Este pueblo me honra con los labios, pero su corazón está lejos de mí. Es inútil el culto que me rinden, porque enseñan doctrinas que no son sino preceptos humanos!* Ustedes dejan a un lado el mandamiento de Dios, para aferrarse a las tradiciones de los hombres". Después, Jesús llamó a la gente y les dijo: "Escúchenme todos y entiéndanme. Nada que entre de fuera puede manchar al hombre; lo que sí lo mancha es lo que sale de dentro; porque del corazón del hombre salen las intenciones malas, las fornicaciones, los robos, los homicidios, los adulterios, las codicias, las injusticias, los fraudes, el desenfreno, las envidias, la difamación, el orgullo y la frivolidad. Todas estas maldades salen de dentro y manchan al hombre".
