

From The Pastor

Whoever Welcomes a Child Welcomes Me

It is amazing how honest the apostles were in describing in Mark's gospel how they were discussing who was the greatest. At the time this occurred they fell silent out of embarrassment when Jesus asked them what they were talking about. One could argue that recording this episode so honestly is one of the strongest arguments in favor of the credibility and reliability of the gospels.

The Gospel of Mark does not offer us a sugarcoated story. It shows men of flesh and blood. How often we try to climb to the top even as we keep others down. But this gospel story also shows us how we can find our way out of an old self-centered attitude that says, "I am the greatest. I am the best."

Jesus was alone with his disciples and wanted to make clear to them something important – his passion, death, and resurrection. It was quite incomprehensible to them. They could not understand that this great Jesus, the Messiah, was one who would suffer out of love for them. This is what it came down to. The great person is not one who makes himself important, but rather the one who serves.

We may feel like we have to have elbows to succeed in our business places and otherwise. Yet, the best leader is considered the one who is genuinely concerned for his colleagues. The business in which there is a strong sense of collective effort toward a goal is the one which is successful rather than the one with a "pecking order" that spoils any joy. Parents who really accompany their children through life experience the greatest family love. When we fall to the weakness of becoming solely centered on ourselves and our success we find that we can miss out on that.

Jesus illustrated this by setting a child in their midst and set him into his arms. He did so as if he were trying to say, "Forget your own importance. Look at children and grow simpler and less complicated! Be open to serving his children like a little child." May we hear his words well when it comes to these decisions in our lives: "Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, and whoever receives me, receives not me but him who sent me." May we put aside any concern about comparing ourselves to another or who is the greatest.




