

We Need to Look Both Ways before We Cross the Street

Like all good parents, we teach our children to stop and look left and right before crossing the street. No one wants to be hit by a moving vehicle. In our case as a parish, it is time to stop and look both to the past and to the future as we prepare to move in a new direction to our friary and church buildings. We are taking a very serious look at renovating our friary for our future with the funds we may receive from our past.

It has been a long year and a half. The combination of change in the age of the buildings, the addition of multiple specialty schools in Chaska, and the continuing sprawl west, has changed our parish's life forever. Covid didn't help us as it did other schools, we just didn't see the growth we heard about from other area private schools. Contrary to the word on the street, we did look left. We looked for trends, we created ideas for new entrances, we asked privately and publicly for monetary support. We cut corners, we combined grade levels, we looked for and received grants. We used up to 60% of all parish donations to support our school. We asked the Archdiocese for strategic advice. We hired marketing and development consultants. After great discernment, we decided that running the school was untenable. We watched as the past to our left after 143 years wasn't going to be the same. It is with some pride that Guardian Angels can say that our past served us well and has provided a strong example of how immigrant people can build a church, a school, a convent, a community with hard work and sacrifice.

Now we look right. We take what we have learned, and we will look to our future. Our future needs to be a financially stable place where we can create and live a new mission of Catholic Christianity to educate, serve, and evangelize. It's a little harder to see to our right. The future isn't certain, but we have a good idea that hard work and sacrifice will help us as it did help our generations before. With a little creativity, we hope to use the assets (our buildings south of Second Street) to create a fund that will help us to cross the street. We have put our school, convent, and the surrounding land that we own on the school block up for sale. We wish to find a buyer that will use our spaces for future good will, and with the purchase, we hope to use the money to update the friary to be our new parish center with new offices, meeting spaces, faith formation rooms, and hospitality space. We have a lot of work to do to the right. We need to know what you see us doing as a parish in the future and how we should best utilize this new space. What small groups, ministries, and joy in coming together do you see? As we mourn the left, we look to the right to see how Jesus is providing for us there. We have places to go, please look right. Moving vehicles come from the right, too.

Why did the Catholic cross the road? Our past and our future are there. The friary building has not been without its own controversy since the 1990s. Tear it down, keep it, left, or right? At some points, there were too many moving vehicles to navigate. We now feel that the time is blessed, and the road has cleared from the left and the right for us to cross the street and live in two buildings instead of four. It is time to use the friary and the church as our only location to thrive as a community. What will the buildings look like? How much will it cost? Can the sale of the school and convent cover the costs of remodeling the friary building? The lessons from the past say that our community is resilient and has always found a way. Our belief in our future has the faith to say that our hard work and our sacrifice for our community will work in our favor. We will love it and we will be proud of it, just like we were and are proud of our past. Will you help Father Tony cross the street? Can we come together in consensus that our future is bright on the north side of the street? Let us know. 

La antigua alianza

En la tradición bíblica, Dios se hace parte de la alianza como protector y salvaguardia de la misma. Es una alianza sencilla y poderosa: seré tu Dios y tú serás mi pueblo (Oseas 2:25). La alianza se daba por participación mutua, a partir de ella se es familia, se es uno y se corre la misma suerte. Se camina unidos hasta el final. Aunque esta alianza es entre Dios y el pueblo, no implica la misma categoría de ambas partes, tampoco igualdad de deberes, no es relación de súbdito con inferior. Dios siempre es fiel a su alianza; nosotros, no siempre. Esta es la relación de Dios con un pueblo concreto, con Israel. La alianza en sí misma es una acción sagrada y se castiga a los agresores. Se lleva a cabo mediante un juramento y quien no la cumpla, paga sus propias consecuencias. Ambas partes, plenamente libres, se adueñan de la alianza al formarla. Los ritos con los que esta alianza se marca son muy profundos: se corta la piel para derramar sangre, se mezcla y se bebe la sangre de ambas partes, se sumergen las manos en un recipiente lleno de sangre para simbolizar que se es uno solo.
