

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

Remembering The Saints Who Have Gone Before Us

It is during the month of November, in particular, that the Catholic Church meditates on the communion of the saints. Saint Teresa of Calcutta once assured her followers, "Mother is here to help you, guide you, and lead you to Jesus. Time is coming closer when Mother also has to go to God. Then Mother will be able to help each one of you more, guide you more and obtain more graces for you." In saying this, she obviously spoke out of her great faith in the communion of the saints, saying only that her work would continue with the greater advantage of being able to help those here on earth from her place with God in heaven. What a remarkable statement of faith! The church is a communion of saints and we say this in our Nicene Creed at Sunday Mass. As God's holy people, we are related through Christ to all other members of the church which includes those still living and those who have preceded us into the Kingdom of Heaven. This union is not interrupted by death, but strengthened. By the intercession of the saints in heaven, being more closely united to Christ, they fix the whole church more firmly in holiness as Saint Teresa expressed this so beautifully (see also Catechism of the Catholic Church 956). When we express devotion to the saints and ask them to pray for us, the union of the whole Church, the Church in heaven and the Church on earth, in the Spirit, is strengthened. Just as communion with each other as fellow pilgrims on earth brings us closer to Christ, so does our communion with the saints join us to Christ. As Saint Polycarp once put it, "We worship Christ as God's Son; we love the martyrs as the Lord's disciples and imitators, and rightly so because of their matchless devotion towards their king and master. May we also be their companions and fellow disciples!" (CCC 957). We pray also for those destined for the kingdom of heaven, but still on the journey on their purgatorial way. Because of the communion of saints, the faithful who are still pilgrims on earth are able to help the souls in purgatory by offering prayers for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice. By our Mass Intentions, we not only pray that the journey to heaven for our loved ones may be made complete, but we remember and celebrate the union that we have with them through Christ even after death. We also help them by almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. Saint John Chrysostom, a great preacher who lived in the 4th century offers us a perspective on this: "Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them" (CCC 1032).

Let us remember, in particular, our loved ones who have been buried from The Church of Saint Nicholas within the past year:

The Great Faith Offering of the Poor Widow

Jesus often taught in the Temple. Today we see him just sitting and watching. He chose a particular spot, "opposite the treasury." There was a great offertory box at the temple. His gaze falls on a poor widow who puts in two copper coins. His gaze is rather striking. Becoming a disciple of Jesus means learning to look at things the way he looks at them. Unless we learn to see people, things, and situations with his eyes, then we have not yet become his disciples.

His disciples were scattered in this scene. They must have found some things more interesting. So Jesus is on his own. But then he calls them together. They are called together like the Church is called together. Jesus, by his call, makes scattered and distracted people into gathered people.

He shows them something to which they have been paying no attention, something really important. What is there to see, apart from her poverty? There is something that only Jesus noticed, because his gaze does not stop with the externals. She has put more than anyone else into the offertory – all she has to live on: literally her whole life – and he sees it.

This is exactly what Jesus wants to show them. Jesus sets before his disciples this widow, who has given everything to God. In her selfless sacrifice, Jesus sees a summary of his whole gospel, a summary of what he would soon do: give his life for us completely. If Jesus' disciples and we do not overlook her, if our eyes are alert to the poor and the little people, we will also understand what is Jesus' inmost concern and what really matters to Jesus.

Lynn Leaving for Family Business

Yesterday, with sincere regret, I tendered my resignation to Father Tony. After five years of hard work with many talented people, we have a bright future for the parish ahead of us. Never before have we had so much possibility of balanced budget, debt elimination, and growth for our sustainable future for both parishes. During the last year, I have split my time between Guardian Angels, Saint Nicholas, and my family's business. It is now imperative that I resign my position with the parishes, and go and work with my family's business. I will stay as business administrator until December 15th as we still have a lot of work to do with construction on the friary, sale of lands, building the community of St. Nicholas and training in the next candidate for this position. It has been a genuine challenge and pleasure to work with Guardian Angels and Saint Nicholas for the last five years. I have learned so much about the resilience and genuine care that the people of these communities have for their parishes. Thank you for our blessed time together! 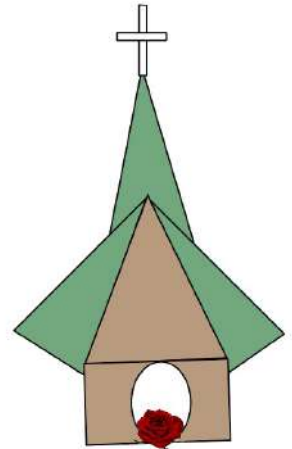


