

God's Great Reordering of Things

The disciples must have been spooked or even terrified when Jesus spoke of the last days. He described the darkness of the sun, the moon failing to give its light, the stars falling from the sky, the powers that be being shaken, and that it would be a time unsurpassed in distress. Are these the provocative images of the wrath of an angry God? Or are they an indication of just how little control that we have in this life?

These are signs, not of an angry God, but of a great spiritual battle and the literature that our readings are taken from is called apocalyptic literature. We can interpret evil in many categories: psychological, social, and political. But none of these goes deep enough. The evil in the world comes from the Evil One himself and our listening to his lies. This is a cosmic struggle and the cross was where Jesus fully engaged him in his twisted power. The Good News is the Church. The Church is that community that exists in the wake of this battle won by Jesus.

So our work of evangelization is the work of summoning the Lord's people from the four corners of the world to join in this holy remnant, this Church in the wake of this cosmic struggle. God is in control! There is darkness when a loved one dies of cancer, or when we lose a job, or when someone does something evil to us. There is darkness when it seems that we are personally losing the spiritual battle. But then in that darkness comes the experience of light – the light of Christ. If we open our hearts, we will experience the coming of the Son of Man. The greatest miracles are not any sign or wonder in the sky, but a person who lets God come to them and who becomes a new creation in Christ.

Advent is coming, but in order to prepare to receive the light of the world, there are some things that need ending. God's ways must be our ways so that when the false securities and shallow guarantees of the world fail us in a time of testing, we can turn our eyes to God's saving light. God will reorder things, and yes there will be tribulation, but we who have faith can look back on our lives with thanksgiving and say that the Lord Jesus has come. May God bless you all in this season of Thanksgiving!




Catholic Campaign for Human Development Collection November 20-21


