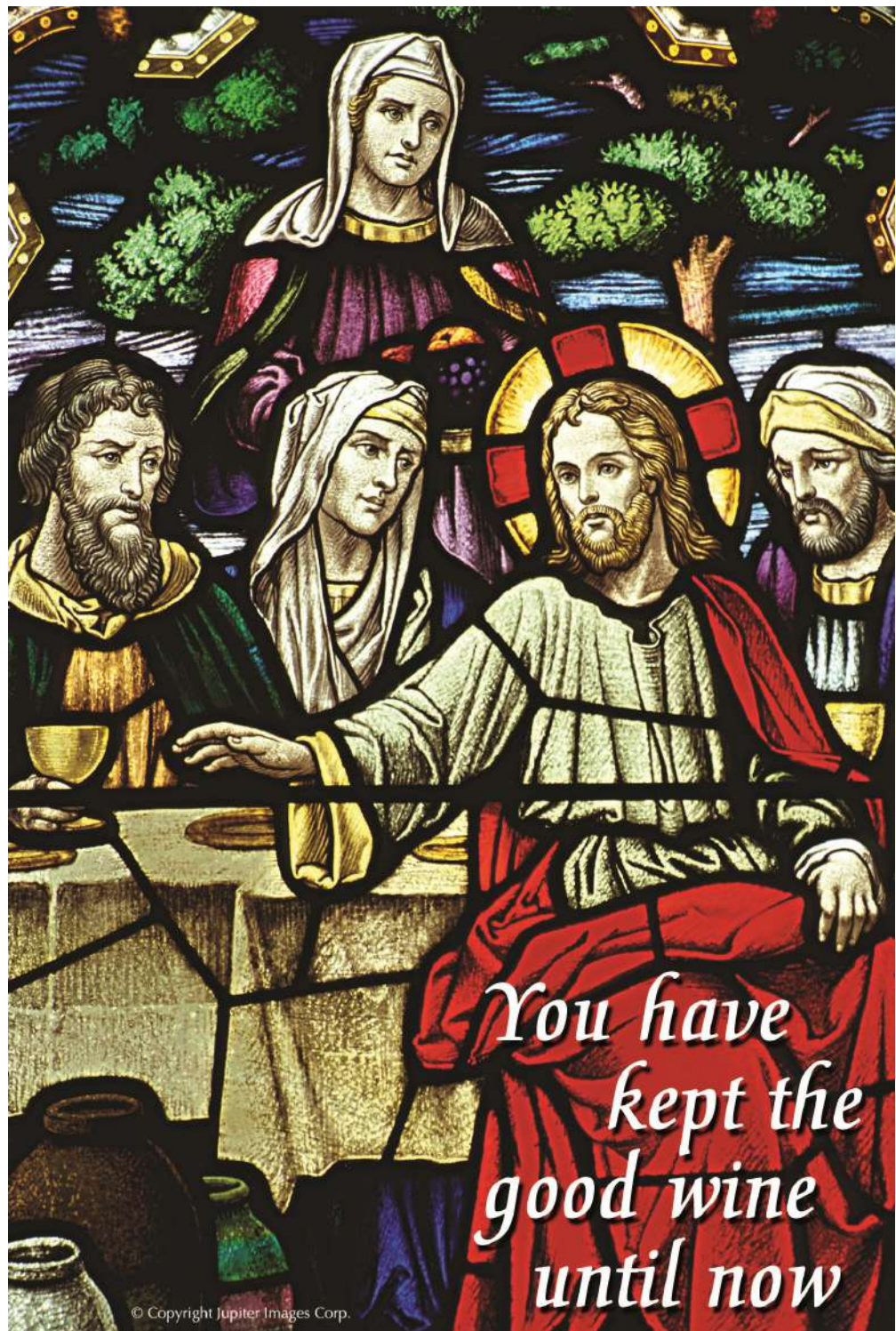

## The Delight of God For Us

Many of us are married or have been married. Think back to the first days, weeks and months of your marriage. God called you to something new! Many of you even received a new name! You began to live your life in a new way. Every day, you gave the ordinary gifts that you had to your husband or wife because of your love for them. When we “Do whatever he tells you” as Mary asks the people at the wedding feast of Cana to do, God transforms those gifts to create a new, secure, and loving relationship, and a legacy of family that will be treasured.

God relates to us also like a groom to his bride. God is the lover and we are the beloved. And God gives a new name and a new beginning to the Israelites because of his extravagant love for them. Instead of “Forsaken” or “Desolate”, God calls them “My Delight” and “Espoused”. This is how much God loves us! God loves us enough to delight in us and to want to create something new for us and transform our lives.

This is always true of God. God created a new Israel out of one that was forsaken. God created a new community filled with the Spirit as our second reading describes. Jesus himself was a new revelation of God. The 180 gallons of new wine that Jesus made from water shows us the extravagant nature of the new love of God found in his Son. Imagine being a member of the crowds that followed him and the hope that you would feel by seeing his new signs and miracles.

Jesus makes this love known to us by changing water into, not simply any wine, but into fine wine. But, again, the servants had to first cooperate by obeying Mary’s request: “Do whatever he tells you.” God will do amazing things for us even when we offer our ordinary gifts. We think of Moses who stuttered and needed Aaron to speak for him. We think of Matthew who was a tax collector, and Peter who was stubborn and did not understand Jesus many times. We think of Martha who worked too much. God chooses all of us to have a part in his new plans for his people.

So, let God create something new in you because he delights in you as in a marriage like a groom delighting in his bride. God’s delight for us is intense. God’s love for us cannot be broken. Then we can live as his disciples empowered by the Spirit. Then we will live as the “espoused” of God.

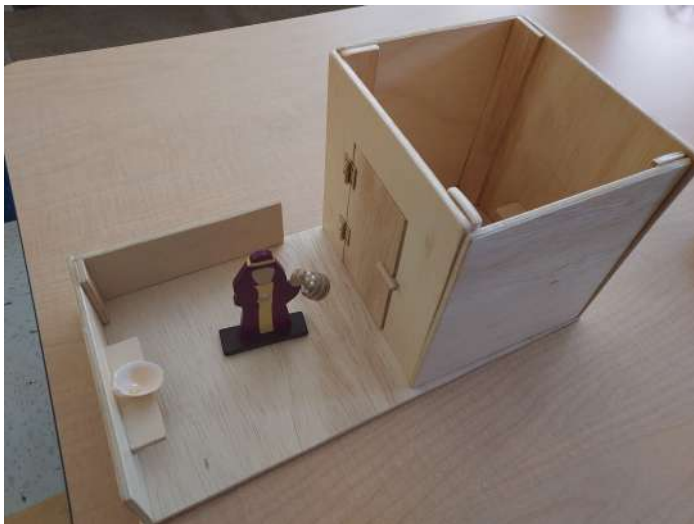
## Catechesis of the Good Shepherd



Jesús mismo fue una nueva revelación de Dios. Los 180 galones de vino nuevo que Jesús hizo con agua nos muestran la naturaleza extravagante del nuevo amor de Dios que se encuentra en su Hijo. Imagínesse ser miembro de las multitudes que lo siguieron y la esperanza que sentiría al ver sus nuevas señales y milagros.

Jesús nos da a conocer este amor al convertir el agua en, no simplemente cualquier vino, sino en vino fino. Pero, de nuevo, los sirvientes primero tenían que cooperar obedeciendo el pedido de María: “Haced lo que él os diga”. Dios hará cosas asombrosas por nosotros incluso cuando le ofrezcamos nuestros dones ordinarios. Pensamos en Moisés, quien tartamudeaba y necesitaba que Aarón hablara por él. Pensamos en Mateo, que era recaudador de impuestos, y en Pedro, que era terco y no entendía a Jesús muchas veces. Pensamos en Martha que trabajaba demasiado. Dios nos elige a todos para tener parte en sus nuevos planes para su pueblo.

Entonces, deja que Dios cree algo nuevo en ti porque se deleita en ti como en un matrimonio como un novio que se deleita en su novia. El deleite de Dios por nosotros es intenso. El amor de Dios por nosotros no se puede romper. Entonces podremos vivir como sus discípulos empoderados por el Espíritu. Entonces viviremos como los “desposados” de Dios.

En este sentido, la Iglesia ha entendido sus metáforas de forma universal, ya que proclama la promesa de Dios de curación, esperanza y felicidad para todos los pueblos, en este mundo y en el otro. Cuando se lee este contexto, la historia de Jesús convirtiendo el agua en vino en las bodas de Canaán se convierte en una revelación de la presencia de Dios en la persona de Jesús, haciendo que estas promesas sean verdaderas para nosotros aquí y ahora, en la transformación de nuestras propias vidas.

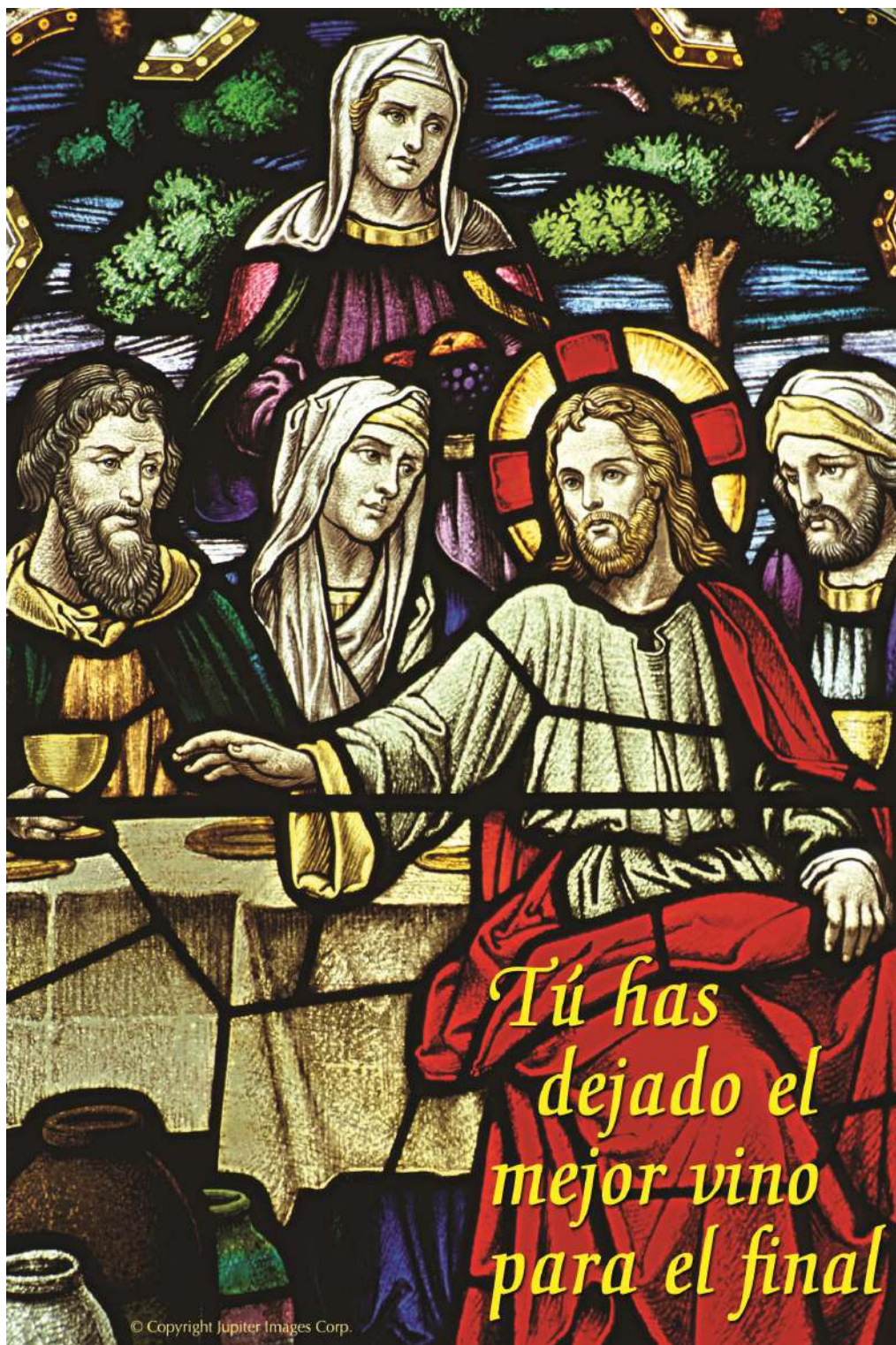
