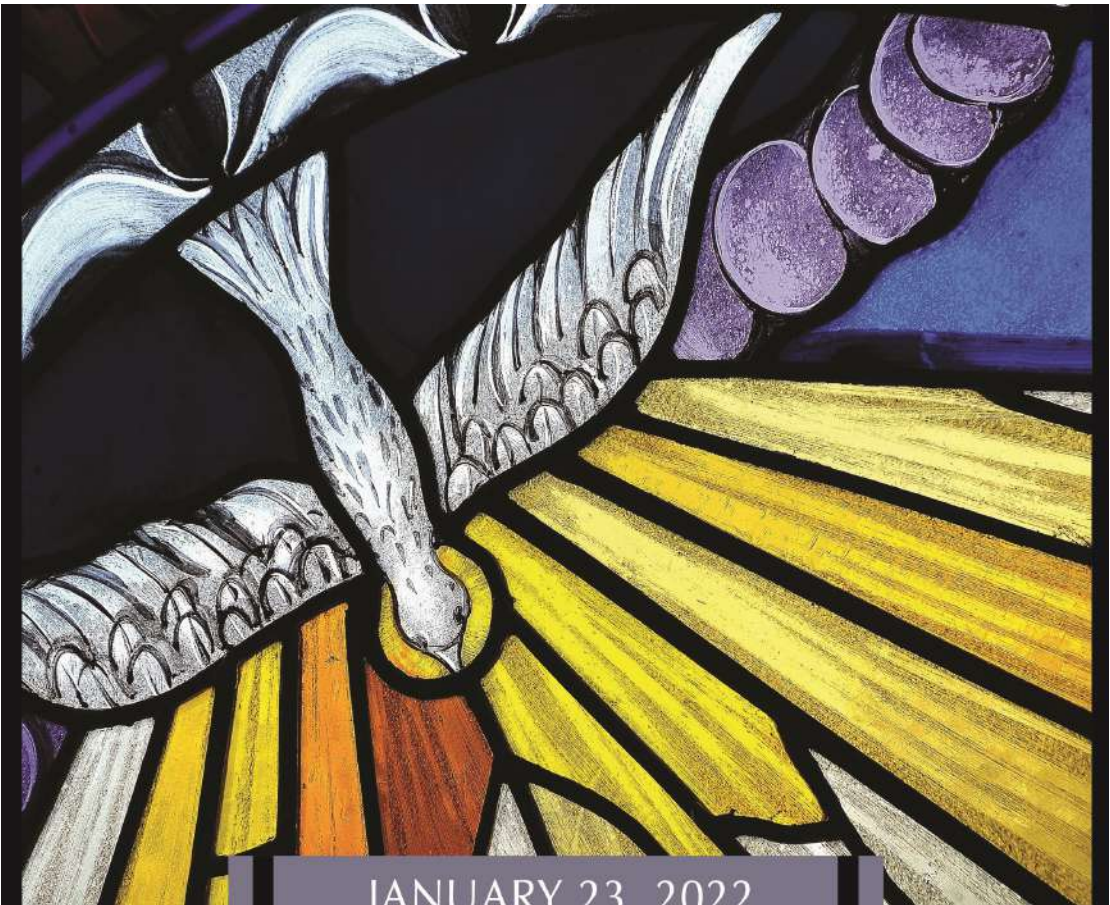

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

Fulfilled in your Hearing

All of us are familiar with inaugural addresses. Jesus gives a kind of inaugural address when he reads from Isaiah in the synagogue at Capernaum. He had spent forty days and forty nights preparing for his public ministry and his words would ring so true: “The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. When all eyes looked intently at him, he said, “Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing.”

Can we carry the torch and make Christ’s saving mission our own? Yes. Emphatically, yes, because Jesus entrusted it to the Church and because, by virtue of our baptism, we are a member of this Church. How can we further the mission of the Church and help to build up God’s kingdom on earth? We must first reject the evil spirits in our lives that seem so inviting or necessary in our lives, so as to live in freedom. We must reject anything that leads us into lust, envy, gluttony, greed, pride, sloth or wrath.

As we observe the anniversary of the infamous supreme court decision of Roe vs. Wade, we can recognize that the greatest impact that we can have is, in many ways, locally and one person at a time. We have the Southwest Options for Women Center in Eden Prairie. It is a resource center for those who are experiencing unplanned pregnancies. The administrator recently called me before Christmas and wanted to sit down with us to learn how we can help. I will call those who signed up on our Time and Talent this past November. But, in the meantime, please let me know of your interest. Often, people in such situations have suffered trauma in their families growing up. At least that is what administrators of such centers tell me.

Jesus’ mission matched the words of his inaugural address to bring freedom to those held captive in webs of lies, deceit and addictive patterns. He offered mercy and forgiveness to those oppressed by their sins and accusers. He befriended the poor and those who had poverty of spirit. He enabled all to see plainly the truth of the beauty of the Father’s kingdom to come.

Let us be a people of this light. The Spirit has anointed you. Let us together by our willing cooperation with his plan in our lives enable this scripture passage that we hear be fulfilled.

In these times of the Covid virus, we need to remind ourselves why attending Mass is so important? St. John Chrysostom reminds us, “You cannot pray at home as at church, where there is a great multitude, where exclamations are cried out to God as from one great heart, and where there is something more: the union of minds, the accord of souls, the bond of charity, the prayers of the priests” (CCC 2179).

Attending the in-person celebration of Sunday Mass and receiving Jesus in the Eucharist are vital to our lives as Catholic Christians. We were created for Communion. Whether you are returning to your home parish, or seeking a local parish on vacation, your participation in the Mass unites you with the Church — the Body of Christ. This communion transforms us as persons and enables us to make manifest the Kingdom of God in our world. The celebration of the Eucharist truly is the source and summit of our faith. Pope Francis, in his homily on the Feast of Corpus Christi in 2018, said, “Jesus prepares a place for us here below, because the Eucharist is the beating heart of the Church. It gives her birth and rebirth; it gathers her together and gives her strength. But the Eucharist also prepares for us a place on high, in eternity, for it is the Bread of heaven.”

Does this mean there is no longer any dispensation from the Sunday and Holy Day obligations due to covid? Correct, there is no longer a dispensation. However, the Church has always recognized that certain circumstances can excuse a person from the requirement to observe the obligation. Persons are excused from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays or Holy Days under the following circumstances:

1. You have reason to believe your health would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness (i.e., you have underlying conditions or are in a high risk category).

2. You exhibit flu-like symptoms.

3. You have good reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., you were in recent contact with someone who tested positive for a contagious illness such as COVID-19 or influenza).

4. You care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed.

5. You are pregnant or you are 65 years of age or older (per the CDC's recommendation for high-risk individuals).

6. You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own (e.g., no Mass is offered; you are infirm; or, while wanting to go, you are prevented for some reason you cannot control, such as your ride did not show up).

7. You have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass.

If situations 1 through 3 apply to you, prudent concern for your neighbor should lead you to stay home. If you fall within situations 4-7, please exercise good judgment, consider the common good, and know you would not be held to the obligation of attending Mass. For further questions about the application of any of these situations, please contact me, your pastor. These categories will be reviewed in due course by the Minnesota Conference of Catholic Bishops and revised as needed.

Those within the categories enumerated above must still observe the Lord's Day and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death, and resurrection; an excellent way to do this is by praying the Liturgy of the Hours and participating in a broadcast/livestream of the Sunday Mass. More information, answers to frequently asked questions, and a portal to each diocese's protocols can be found at the website backtomassmn.org. Thank you for considering these issues carefully and prayerfully.



Cumplido en su audiencia

Todos nosotros estamos familiarizados con los discursos inaugurales. Jesús da una especie de discurso inaugural cuando lee de Isaías en la sinagoga de Capernaum. Había pasado cuarenta días y cuarenta noches preparándose para su ministerio público y sus palabras sonarían tan verdaderas: “El Espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque me ha ungido para traer buenas nuevas a los pobres. Me ha enviado a proclamar libertad a los cautivos y dar vista a los ciegos, a poner en libertad a los oprimidos y a proclamar un año agradable al Señor.

Cuando todos los ojos lo miraron fijamente, dijo: “Hoy se cumple este pasaje de la Escritura en presencia de ustedes”. ¿Podemos llevar la antorcha y hacer nuestra la misión salvífica de Cristo? Si. Enfáticamente sí, porque Jesús se lo encomendó a la Iglesia y porque, en virtud de nuestro bautismo, somos miembros de esta Iglesia. ¿Cómo podemos promover la misión de la Iglesia y ayudar a construir el reino de Dios en la tierra? Primero debemos rechazar los espíritus malignos en nuestras vidas que parecen tan atractivos o necesarios en nuestras vidas, para vivir en libertad. Tenemos el Southwest Options for Women Center en Eden Prairie. Es un centro de recursos para aquellas que están experimentando embarazos no planificados. El administrador me llamó recientemente antes de Navidad y quería sentarse con nosotros para saber cómo podemos ayudar. Llamaré a aquellos que se inscribieron en nuestro Tiempo y Talento en noviembre pasado. Pero, mientras tanto, hágamelo saber de su interés. A menudo, las personas en tales situaciones han sufrido traumas en sus familias mientras crecían. Al menos eso es lo que me dicen los administradores de dichos centros. La misión de Jesús coincidió con las palabras de su discurso inaugural para llevar la libertad a los cautivos en redes de mentiras, engaños y patrones adictivos. Ofreció misericordia y perdón a los oprimidos por sus pecados y acusadores. Se hizo amigo de los pobres y de los que tenían pobreza de espíritu. Permitted que todos vieran claramente la verdad de la belleza del reino venidero del Padre. Seamos un pueblo de esta luz. El Espíritu te ha ungido. Juntos, mediante nuestra cooperación voluntaria con su plan en nuestras vidas, permitamos que se cumpla este pasaje de las Escrituras que escuchamos.

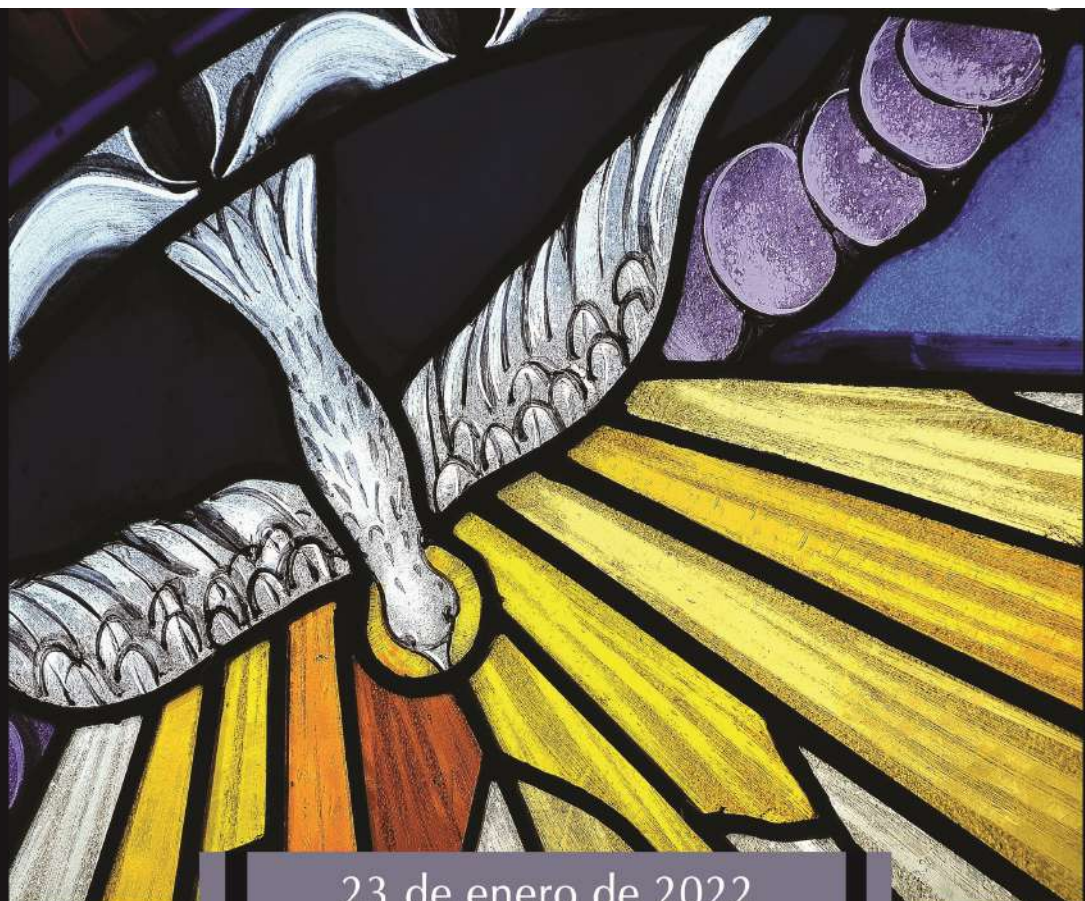
