Matrimony: Marriage preparation is required. Please call Father Tony VanderLoop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 at least 8 months in advance.


Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

OUR LORD'S DIVINE MERCY

Happy Easter everyone! I wish you and your families a grace-filled Easter season that brings your family together by his love which has conquered all sin and death. I wish to write about today, Divine Mercy Sunday. This Sunday, the second Sunday of Easter, was declared Divine Mercy Sunday by Pope John Paul II on April 30th, 2000 at the canonization of Sister Faustina Kowalska. This day was rightly regarded as so important by our late and beloved pope, that he was made Blessed in Rome on this very day on May 1st

2011 and canonized a saint on this very day on April 27th, 2014. The last text prepared by our late and beloved Holy Father, written from his hospital bed and read after his death teaches us about the great gift of Divine Mercy. He writes, "Today the glorious Alleluia of Easter resounds. Today's Gospel from John emphasizes that on the evening of that day he appeared to the Apostles and 'showed them his hands and his side' (Jn 20:20), that is, the sign of the painful passion with which his Body was indelibly stamped, even after the Resurrection. Those glorious wounds, which he allowed doubting Thomas to touch eight days later, reveal the mercy of God who 'so loved the world that he gave his only Son' (Jn 3:16). ...Lord, who reveal the Father's love by your death and Resurrection, we believe in you and confidently repeat to you today: Jesus, I trust in you, have mercy upon us and upon the whole world."

Mercy, which we are completely dependent on, is a hallmark of our Catholic faith. In fact, our beloved and late pope called mercy love's second name. The corporal and spiritual works of mercy flow from divine mercy itself revealed so vividly to Thomas. In the Good Samaritan parable, Jesus answers a man's question, "Who is my neighbor?" by showing that the neighbor is one who shows mercy. In the Last Judgment of Matthew 25 the sheep that are saved are the ones who did works of mercy – feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, visiting the sick, visiting the imprisoned and burying the dead. These would be later called the Corporal Works of Mercy. And the account that Jesus gives of the Last Judgment reveals to us that when they are done to the least brothers and sisters they are done to Jesus.

I encourage you to pray the novena of Divine Mercy which began on Good Friday (you can begin now and catch up). While we do not have a Divine Mercy celebration this year, due to many factors, I encourage you to go to one in this area. LA DIVINA MISERICORDIA DE NUESTRO SEÑOR

Feliz Pascua a todos! Les deseo a ustedes y a sus familias una temporada de Pascua llena de gracia que une a su familia por su amor que ha conquistado todo pecado y muerte. Deseo escribir sobre el día de hoy, Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Este domingo, el segundo domingo de Pascua, fue

declarado Domingo de la Divina Misericordia por el Papa Juan Pablo II el 30 de abril de 2000 en la canonización de Sor Faustina Kowalska. Este día fue considerado tan importante por nuestro difunto y amado Papa, que fue bendecido en Roma en este mismo día el 1 de mayo de 2011 y canonizado como santo en este mismo día el 27 de abril de 2014. El último texto preparado por nuestro El difunto y amado Santo Padre, escrito desde su cama de hospital y leído después de su muerte, nos enseña sobre el gran don de la Divina Misericordia. Escribe: "Hoy resuena el Aleluya glorioso de la Pascua. El Evangelio de hoy de Juan subraya que en la tarde de ese día se apareció a los Apóstoles y 'les mostró las manos y el costado' (Jn 20,20), es decir, el signo de la dolorosa pasión con la que su Cuerpo estaba indeleblemente estampado, incluso después de la Resurrección. Aquellas llagas gloriosas, que ocho días después permitió que el incrédulo Tomás tocara, revelan la misericordia de Dios que "tanto amó al mundo que dio a su Hijo único" (Jn 3,16). ... Señor, que revelas el amor del Padre por tu muerte y resurrección, creemos en ti y te lo repetimos hoy con confianza: Jesús, en ti confío, ten misericordia de nosotros y del mundo entero". La misericordia, de la que dependemos completamente, es un sello distintivo de nuestra fe católica. De hecho, nuestro amado y difunto Papa llamó el segundo nombre del amor misericordioso. Las obras de misericordia corporales y espirituales brotan de la misma misericordia divina revelada tan vívidamente a Tomás. En la parábola del Buen Samaritano, Jesús responde a la pregunta de un hombre: "¿Quién es mi prójimo?" mostrando que el prójimo es el que tiene misericordia. En el Juicio Final de Mateo 25, las ovejas que se salvan son las que hicieron obras de misericordia: alimentar al hambriento, dar de beber al sediento, recibir al extranjero, vestir al desnudo, visitar al enfermo, visitar al encarcelado y enterrar a los muertos. Éstas serían luego llamadas las Obras de Misericordia Corporales. Y el relato que da Jesús del Juicio Final nos revela que cuando se hacen a los hermanos y hermanas más pequeños se hacen a Jesús. Los animo a rezar la novena de la Divina Misericordia que comenzó el Viernes Santo (pueden comenzar ahora y ponerse al día). Si bien no tenemos una celebración de la Divina Misericordia este año, debido a muchos factores, los animo a que vayan a una en esta área.
