Baptism: Our Baptism Belonging Class is required for all parents as a first step to Baptism of your child. Please call Father Tony VanderLoop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 to sign up for a class. We encourage Godparents to attend. Baptisms are scheduled once per month after the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. Special dates requested for Baptism will be considered and accommodated depending on circumstances.

Reconciliation: Saturdays at GA from 8:00 - 8:45 a.m. and 3:15 - 4:15 p.m. or by appt.

Matrimony: Marriage preparation is required. Please call Father Tony VanderLoop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 at least 8 months in advance.

Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

JESUS IS MORE PRESENT TO US NOW, NOT LESS

Jesus was in his very person, the meeting of heaven and earth. In Him, God and humanity came together. His entire ministry was the outward expression of this inward identity. His whole work, it could be said, was the bringing of humanity and divinity together. In the Lord's prayer, we say, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." This sums it up! In His passion and death, Jesus effectively brought heaven all the way down. He carried the divine life and light into the darkest places of humanity – places of hatred, cruelty, violence and corruption. The divine life is brought into even the darkest aspects of earth. We know from the resurrection that heaven transforms even those places and the divine love is more powerful. This is the Good News. In the face of all of the corrupt kingdoms of the world, the Church announces that God is king!

In light of this basic gospel message, we hear at the Ascension of our Lord that Jesus spoke of the kingdom of God and the reign of God. The disciples have been given power and a new commission to tell everyone of this Good News. Then Jesus was taken up into heaven. But we should not think of this spatially as though he escaped from earth and went away from humanity. Rather, Jesus from heaven, is now reigning over the earth. We hear that he is seated at the right hand of the Father. This is symbolic language that lets us know that he is reigning over earth on behalf of the Father.

So our Lord, Jesus is more, not less present to us here on earth. He is directing the things of earth and of the Church from his place in heaven. He is not present in human form only to Israel, but in his glorified body he is present to all of creation. And he continues the work of building up his kingdom here below. Think of hiking up a mountain. From the vantage point of the summit we see all around us and, in a sense, are present to what is all around us.

So the Ascension forces us to ask, Who do we finally obey? Do we allow him to direct all that is happening here below? Our Lord is not a figure of the past to be vaguely remembered, but here present with us now from heaven. This is why the angel says, "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" It is as if the angel is saying, "Get to work. You have a king with your marching orders to build up the kingdom under His direction." We have many gifts with which God has blessed us to do that with. May we use them all to his glory and under His command and direction. May God bless you all.

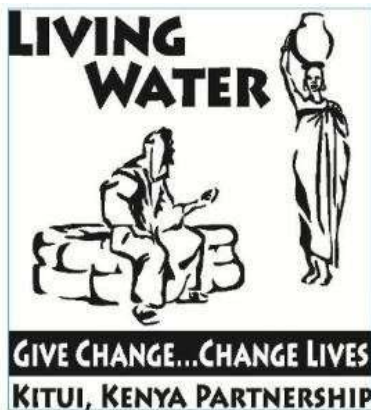

JESÚS ESTÁ MÁS PRESENTE PARA NOSOTROS AHORA, NO MENOS

Jesús era en su misma persona, el encuentro del cielo y la tierra. En Él, Dios y la humanidad se unieron. Todo su ministerio fue la expresión exterior de esta identidad interior. Todo su trabajo, podría decirse, fue unir a la humanidad y la divinidad. En la oración del Señor, decimos: “Venga tu reino, hágase tu voluntad, así en la tierra como en el cielo”. ¡Esto lo resume todo! En Su pasión y muerte, Jesús efectivamente trajo el cielo hasta el fondo. Llevó la vida y la luz divinas a los lugares más oscuros de la humanidad: lugares de odio, crueldad, violencia y corrupción. La vida divina es traída incluso a los aspectos más oscuros de la tierra. Sabemos por la resurrección que el cielo transforma incluso esos lugares y el amor divino es más poderoso. Éstas son las buenas noticias. ¡Frente a todos los reinos corruptos del mundo, la Iglesia anuncia que Dios es el rey! A la luz de este mensaje básico del evangelio, escuchamos en la Ascensión de nuestro Señor que Jesús habló del reino de Dios y el reinado de Dios. A los discípulos se les ha dado poder y una nueva comisión para anunciar a todos esta Buena Noticia. Entonces Jesús fue llevado al cielo. Pero no debemos pensar en esto espacialmente como si se escapara de la tierra y se alejara de la humanidad. Más bien, Jesús del cielo, ahora reina sobre la tierra. Oímos que está sentado a la diestra del Padre. Este es un lenguaje simbólico que nos permite saber que él está reinando sobre la tierra en nombre del Padre. Así que nuestro Señor, Jesús está más, no menos presente para nosotros aquí en la tierra. Él está dirigiendo las cosas de la tierra y de la Iglesia desde su lugar en el cielo. Él no está presente en forma humana solo para Israel, sino que en su cuerpo glorificado está presente para toda la creación. Y continúa la obra de edificar su reino aquí abajo. Piensa en escalar una montaña. Desde el punto de vista de la cumbre, vemos todo lo que nos rodea y, en cierto sentido, estamos presentes en todo lo que nos rodea. Entonces la Ascensión nos obliga a preguntar, ¿A quién obedecemos finalmente? ¿Le permitimos que dirija todo lo que está pasando aquí abajo? Nuestro Señor no es una figura del pasado para ser vagamente recordada, sino aquí presente con nosotros ahora desde el cielo. Por eso el ángel dice: ¿Por qué estás ahí parado mirando al cielo? Es como si el ángel estuviera diciendo, “Ponte a trabajar. Tienes un rey con tus órdenes de marcha para construir el reino bajo Su dirección”. Tenemos muchos dones con los que Dios nos ha bendecido para hacer eso. Que podamos usarlos a todos para su gloria y bajo su mando y dirección. Que Dios los bendiga a todos.


