Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

NOT WITH FIRE AND SWORD

Jesus speaks with mysterious and terrifying words in our gospel today: “I came to cast fire upon the earth...Do you think that I have come to give peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division.” So, are we deceiving ourselves when we think of Jesus as, above all, gentle and loving and the bringer of peace? Are critics right who say that “organized religion” is responsible for great division among people through the centuries of history and has been the cause of much violence?

What is Jesus really saying? The fire he is talking about is not the fire of war and devastation but the fire of the Holy Spirit. “Kindle us in the fire of your love,” we say.

Jesus longs for that fire to burn. It is the fire that burns away hatred. It is the fire of love for one’s enemies that is prepared to go to the cross for the good of another and to love until it hurts for our neighbor in need, as Saint Teresa of Calcutta used to say. This is a fire that Jesus wants to be spread from one person to another.

Why then is there division? It is because we have to decide for or against Christ and for or against love. This can bring divisions within a family. It can lead to painful estrangement, to mockery or to misunderstanding. What can we do if it comes to this? We can make efforts to pray for those who persecute or mistreat us. If we stop praying for them, we are presuming that God cannot heal them or bring them to conversion. We can never doubt the power of God. And we can also make efforts to love. Love can construct bridges of understanding. And we cannot forget that division runs through our own hearts too. We are often divided between love of Christ and our weaknesses that incline us toward the beginnings of evil. When we realize this, we will be more patient and loving with others.

NO CON FUEGO Y ESPADA

Jesús habla con palabras misteriosas y aterradoras en nuestro evangelio de hoy: “Fuego vine a echar en la tierra... ¿Pensáis que he venido a traer paz a la tierra? No, te digo, sino más bien división”. Entonces, ¿nos estamos engañando a nosotros mismos cuando pensamos en Jesús como, sobre todo, manso, afable y portador de paz? ¿Tienen razón los críticos que dicen que la “religión organizada” es responsable de una gran división entre las personas a lo largo de los siglos de la historia y ha sido la causa de mucha violencia? ¿Qué está diciendo realmente Jesús? El fuego del que está hablando no es el fuego de la guerra y la devastación, sino el fuego del Espíritu Santo. “Enciéndonos en el fuego de tu amor”, decimos. Jesús anhela que ese fuego arda. Es el fuego que quema el odio. Es el fuego del amor por los enemigos que se prepara para ir a la cruz por el bien del otro y amar hasta el dolor por el prójimo necesitado, como decía Santa Teresa de Calcuta. Este es un fuego que Jesús quiere que se propague de una persona a otra. ¿Por qué entonces hay división? Es porque tenemos que decidir a favor o en contra de Cristo ya favor o en contra del amor. Esto puede traer divisiones dentro de una familia. Puede conducir a un distanciamiento doloroso, a la burla o a la incomprensión. ¿Qué podemos hacer si se trata de esto? Podemos hacer esfuerzos para orar por aquellos que nos persiguen o maltratan. Si dejamos de orar por ellos, estamos suponiendo que Dios no puede sanarlos o llevarlos a la conversión. Nunca podemos dudar del poder de Dios. Y también podemos hacer esfuerzos para amar. El amor puede construir puentes de comprensión. Y no podemos olvidar que la división también corre a través de nuestros propios corazones. A menudo estamos divididos entre el amor de Cristo y nuestras debilidades que nos inclinan hacia los principios del mal. Cuando nos demos cuenta de esto, seremos más pacientes y amorosos con los demás.


