Special dates requested for Baptism will be considered and accommodated depending on circumstances.

Matrimony: Marriage preparation is required. Please call Father Tony Vanderloop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 at least 8 months in advance.

Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

THE NARROW DOOR

“Will those who are saved be few?” This was the question that someone asked Jesus in our gospel today. Maybe this person was just trying to get a sense of how hard it is to enter the kingdom. We can in any case credit him with being concerned with the question of what happens after death. People in earlier centuries were profoundly concerned by the question of eternal salvation. For us too, we cannot ignore the question. At the end of our life we will ask, “What have I done with my life? What is awaiting me after death?” As is often the case, Jesus makes no direct reply to the question put to him, but rather

says to strive to enter through the narrow gate. It is a narrow door through which I have to pass. It is no path for a pleasant stroll, nor is it a wide road, by which I get to heaven. I must stake everything on walking this narrow path to get there.

Where is the narrow door? It is not simply at the end of my life. It stands in the middle of my life. I can always pass it by or go through it. Every little action, gesture of attention, kind word, and every step in exercising my willpower, so as to not give way to my desires and moods but turn toward someone who needs me, is itself a step through the narrow door. Every time I do not hit back when I receive an undeserved blow, every time I assent to a cross I have to bear is itself taking me part of the way through the little door that leads to the blessed life.

And Jesus, as he often does, speaks through a parable. If we do not start to work on ourselves until the hour of our death, we might be too late. We would risk Jesus saying to us, “I do not know you.” What if I realize that up to now I have far too often chose the broad path? It is not too late to wake up. I am still able to do good, even if in only very little things. Jesus will see them, and with great patience and love he will help me through the narrow door! ~Father Tony

LA PUERTA ESTRECHA

¿Serán pocos los que se salven?” Esta fue la pregunta que alguien le hizo a Jesús en nuestro evangelio de hoy. Tal vez esta persona solo estaba tratando de tener una idea de lo difícil que es entrar al reino. En cualquier caso, podemos darle crédito por estar preocupado por la cuestión de qué sucede después de la muerte. La gente de siglos anteriores estaba profundamente preocupada por la cuestión de la salvación eterna. Para nosotros también, no podemos ignorar la pregunta. Al final de nuestra vida nos preguntaremos: “¿Qué he hecho con mi vida? ¿Qué me espera después de la muerte? Como suele ser el caso, Jesús no responde directamente a la pregunta que se le hace, sino que dice que nos esforcemos por entrar por la puerta estrecha. Es una puerta estrecha por la que tengo que pasar. No es camino de agradable paseo, ni es camino ancho, por el cual llego al cielo. Debo apostar todo a caminar por este camino angosto para llegar allí. ¿Dónde está la puerta estrecha? No es simplemente al final de mi vida. Se encuentra en medio de mi vida. Siempre puedo pasar de largo o atravesarlo. Cada pequeña acción, gesto de atención, palabra amable y cada paso en el ejercicio de mi fuerza de voluntad, para no ceder a mis deseos y estados de ánimo, sino volverme hacia alguien que me necesita, es en sí mismo un paso a través de la puerta estrecha. Cada vez que no devuelvo el golpe cuando recibo un golpe inmerecido, cada vez que acepto una cruz que tengo que llevar, es ella misma una parte del camino que me lleva a través de la puertecita que conduce a la vida bendita. Y Jesús, como suele hacer, habla a través de una parábola. Si no empezamos a trabajar en nosotros mismos hasta la hora de nuestra muerte, puede que lleguemos demasiado tarde. Correríamos el riesgo de que Jesús nos dijera: “No os conozco”. ¿Qué pasa si me doy cuenta de que hasta ahora he elegido con demasiada frecuencia el camino ancho? No es demasiado tarde para despertar. Todavía soy capaz de hacer el bien, aunque sea en cosas muy pequeñas. ¡Jesús los verá y con gran paciencia y amor me ayudará a pasar por la puerta estrecha! ~Padre Tony

FATHER JIM DEVORAK CELEBRATES HIS 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF ORDINATION

We will be acknowledging Father Devorak's 50th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood at Saint Nicholas in Carver at the 10:00 Mass on Sunday, August 28th with a reception after Mass at the Saint Nicholas Parish Center. We invite you to come and celebrate with him!

Fr. Jim was born in Canby, MN, and grew up in Madison, MN. He was ordained August 27th, 1972 for the Diocese of New Ulm at St. Michael in Madison by Bishop Alphonse J. Schladweiler. Following ordination his parish assignments included: Holy Redeemer in Marshall, Holy Rosary in North Mankato, Holy Rosary in Graceville, St. Barnabas in Barry, St. George in Glencoe, St. Andrew in Fairfax, St. Dionysius in Tyler, St. Genevieve in Lake Benton, St. Pius X in Glencoe, St. Anastasia in Hutchinson, St. Boniface in Stewart, St. Joseph in Montevideo, St. Andrew in Granite Falls, St. Clara in Clara City, St. John in Darwin and assisting in the Seeker of Souls Area Faith Community, St. Gertrude in Forest City, St. Mary in Willmar and assisting in the Jesus Our Living Waters Area Faith Community, St. Patrick in Kandiyohi, St. Thomas More in Lake Lillian, Our Lady of the Lakes in Spicer, St. John in Ortonville, and St. Joseph in Rosen.

Since then he has served the following parishes in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis: St. Bernard in St. Paul, St. Rose of Lima and Corpus Christi in Roseville, St. Girard in Brooklyn Park, and Immaculate Conception in Watertown. On June 30th, 2021 Fr. Jim retired from active ministry in the Archdiocese. He currently lives in Jordan at the edge of town at 940 Broadway St. S. He enjoys helping with Masses at Guardian Angels in Chaska, St. Nicholas in Carver, St. John the Baptist in Savage, Pax Christi in Eden Prairie, and other nearby parishes.


