JUSTICE SHALL FLOURISH IN HIS TIME, AND FULLNESS OF PEACE FOREVER

Our readings today are a study in contrasts. Our gospel proposes to us a strange figure: John the Baptizer. He ate locusts and wild honey. He wore camel's hair and lived in the desert. He was a hard hitter. His call to repentance was hard and relentless. He did not tell people what they wanted to hear.

So why did they flock to him in the desert rather than go to the Temple as was normal? It was because he was credible. His hard-hitting call to repentance came from profound kind-heartedness in which he genuinely cared about what he was saying and cared about those who heard his message. His call to repentance affected hearts and it should have because the coming of Jesus was imminent! The prophet Isaiah, on the other hand, spoke of Jesus coming from afar, and gave us beautiful, comforting images of a wolf being a guest of a lamb and a leopard lying down with a kid and a little child to guide them and the earth being filled with the knowledge of the Lord. Isaiah communicates to us that God will come and righteousness will be restored. Everything will be set right.

We need both the message from afar, which is a message of hope, and the urgent message to prepare for his imminent coming. Those who really could hear, understand, and respond to each message were the lowly ones. Jesus says that what has been hidden from the learned and the clever will be revealed to the merest children.

Do we want more? Do we want more than the righteousness of God? What could be greater than the Savior who will come to restore this righteousness? But if we are to welcome him, we must heed the call of John the Baptizer and let go of wanting more. Heeding his call to repentance may mean slowing down, letting go of the things that pull us away from God this Advent season, and allowing his will to take over in the choices we make. His simple life gave powerful testimony to Jesus, our King, who was and is to come. May we be ready to receive him this Christmas and give that same testimony to those around us!

It is intended that participants attend all three nights in order to prepare and transform their hearts and minds as they encounter God's healing love, but you are most welcome to come as you are able.


