

# THE JOURNEY IS THE GOAL



In this life we are on the way and on a journey. When we speak of our journey through life, we look back and realize that it has not been a perfectly straight road. Often, it has not even been clearly laid out, nor has it been a broad, comfortable road. Not until life's end is the journey over.

Jesus is talking about this goal in today's Gospel, which He spoke about on the eve before His great suffering. Instead of the disciples comforting Jesus, He is comforting them. He speaks of a reunion "in my Father's house." He promises all those who are now confused saying that He will not leave them all alone. I go before you; I will prepare a place for you

there, and then I will come and get you so that we are always together there, He says, essentially. We sense His tender heart here when He says not a word about His own imminent suffering. But what good is this absolutely beautiful prospect of the eternal home if we do not know the way to get there? These are the sentiments of doubting Thomas who always wants to know everything exactly. In reply, Jesus points to Himself: "I am the way!" No one comes home, to the eternal goal, "but through Me."

How can a man call Himself the way and the only way to reach the goal? Jesus already did that the previous Sunday when He referred to Himself as the Shepherd and the gate. Moreover, He is the way and the goal. "I am the way, the truth, and the life." It is quite understandable that people thought He was crazy. But each of us must come to the conclusion in all of our daily events and living that Jesus is the only way. Those who have done so, have borne witness that they have traveled well on this way. They have trusted Him, staked all on Him, and He has not disappointed them. They have truly found life.

Our state lawmakers need to hear from you! There are multiple bills being considered that will impact children and families here in Minnesota. Please go to MNCatholic.org/ActionAlerts to learn about the issues and send messages urging your legislators to:

- 1. Pass a robust child tax credit that will support families doing the hard work of raising the next generation amid increasing economic pressures.
- Vote NO on the legalization of recreational marijuana. We know this will negatively impact families, especially those who bear the cross of addiction, and will put children at greater risk of accidental overdose and drug abuse.
