WHY BEGIN WITH SMALL GROUPS

Dear brothers and sisters,

This article will be part of a series of articles on small groups. So, why small groups for our parishes of the archdiocese? This is an apt question. The archbishop could not help but recall the more than 35,000 comments in our three-year synod process that began in 2019. These comments eventually yielded 40 propositions that were discerned, discussed and voted on at the historic Synod Assembly after a team from each parish did the same. It was clear that many comments related to small groups. The archbishop prayed and reflected on the example of Jesus himself as he lived his public ministry in the company of friends. We could say that in choosing the Twelve Apostles, Jesus formed the original Christian small group, and once again set the example by saying, "Follow me." Now, throughout history Christians have done just that. They have formed small groups to renew the Church. For example, many religious orders started when a saint formed a small group.

One example of a saint who started small groups was Saint Paul, our patron. On his missionary journeys Saint Paul collaborated closely with a lay couple, Priscilla and Aquila, whom he called his "co-workers in Christ Jesus." Paul writes of them, "Greet Priscilla and Aquila, my co-workers in Christ Jesus, who risked their necks for my life to whom not only I am grateful, but also all the churches of the Gentiles; greet also the Church at their house" (Romans 16: 3-5). The phrase "...at their house" reveals to us that Priscilla and Aquila were co-workers with Paul precisely in their leadership of a small group of the Christian faithful who gathered regularly in their home.

In fact, we could say that the "house church" of the New Testament was a kind of small group. In the early Church, lay persons were charged with caring for a representative group of the faithful that met at their house. Saint Paul was trying to spread the Christian faith throughout Rome, Corinth, and Syria. As we would imagine that it was not highly developed in those cultures at the time, we can also imagine how consoling it was for him to know that lay persons were charged with caring for a representative group of the faithful who met at their house. Acts 5:42 helps us to understand what this must have been like and can be for us. It says, "All day long, both at the temple and in their homes, they did not stop teaching and proclaiming the Messiah, Jesus."

This speaks of a dual strategy in the early church in that there is preaching "from above" publicly in the temple. But there is also preaching "from below" or "house by house" as was done in the home of Priscilla and Aquila. This was part of the key to the success of evangelization in the early church. Under the authority of the Church and the apostles, lay people felt free and empowered to proclaim Jesus house by house, to care for one another, and even to shepherd small groups of the faithful who were gathering in their home.

Now, even recent popes have written about small groups. It should be no wonder why, with this direction "from above" and with the synod "from below" that our own archbishop sees this as an essential point of beginning for renewal in our local church. Saint John Paul II envisioned the parish as a community of communities: "One way of renewing parishes, especially urgent for parishes in large cities, might be to consider the parish as a community of communities and movements. It seems timely therefore to form ecclesial communities and groups of a size that allows for true human relationships. (*Ecclesia in America*, 1999, no. 41). Our archbishop envisions Jesus marvelously proclaimed by priests and deacons at church, but also "house by house" by lay persons who have been empowered by the Holy Spirit to be missionary disciples within the Catholic Church.

We are entrusted with making this a reality! The archbishop wants everyone to be part of a small group. Imagine how we can change the world around us if we do. Come, Holy Spirit, come!

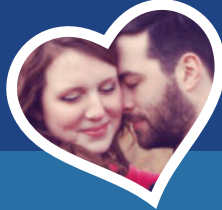
