STOP DISCRIMINATION AGAINST NONPUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS

For decades, the state of Minnesota has made a commitment to all students, including those attending private schools, to fund certain essential services such as nursing, counseling, instructional aids, and busing. But Governor Walz’s budget proposal for the next biennium completely cuts nonpublic pupil aid and nonpublic transportation aid – programs that amount to \$1,080 per year per student in lost aid for essential services and transportation. Nonpublic schools already save the state nearly \$500 million annually by educating students outside the public school system. Cutting aid undermines this cost-effective partnership and unfairly targets families who rely on nonpublic schools that serve their child’s needs.

It would lead to increased costs for families, likely leading to higher tuition and potentially putting nonpublic education out of reach for many. For example, at Saint Therese Catholic School in Deephaven, 60% of its students depend on busing to access its nurturing environment. Transitioning to private busing would, for this school, necessitate an exorbitant tuition increase of \$3,500 per student per year – a financial strain that most families simply cannot endure. Beyond busing, nonpublic pupil aid is vital for accessing essential educational resources including textbooks, testing, nursing services, and guidance and counseling services that directly benefit students’ learning and well-being.

Such a proposal would ultimately most harm low-income and middle-income families who are served by nonpublic schools and in many cases having difficulty raising money just to continue attending. Furthermore, continuing funding commitment to these programs would actually save the state money by ensuring students and families have the resources they need and avoiding the necessity of many students having to transfer to public schools.

Speak up now for equal access for all students. Nonpublic pupil aid ensures that every student has access to the tools all students need to thrive, regardless of their school. Speak up now for support for families. Cuts to this aid would burden families financially, potentially forcing them to abandon their school of choice. Stand with Catholic and other nonpublic school students and families. Tell the Governor and your legislators to protect funding for nonpublic pupil aid and transportation aid.

44TH ANNUAL MN FOODSHARE MARCH CAMPAIGN

Now in its 44th year, the Minnesota Food Share statewide campaign brings awareness to the need for food shelves while collecting critical food and funds at a time when inventories are at their lowest following the holidays. This collaborative effort unites organizations, businesses, faith communities, and individuals to support over 300 food shelves across the state.

At Bountiful Basket Food Shelf, we're committed to eliminating food insecurity for the 9,000+ individuals we serve annually. Over the past year, we experienced a 72% increase in individuals served, underscoring the growing need in our community. In response, we expanded our capacity with the opening of a second site in Cologne in 2023 and an off-site pantry at West Creek Apartments in 2024. These milestones, alongside launching additional mobile deliveries, school snack and weekend food programs to our local schools, foster care and immunization food bag initiatives with the county, and more—have resulted in a remarkable 226% increase in individuals served since 2022.

This growth is part of a larger trend across Minnesota, where food insecurity is rising at unprecedented rates. Feeding America reports that 537,890 Minnesotans, including 34% under age 10, are facing hunger. In 2024, Minnesotans made a record-breaking 9 million visits to food shelves, a 20% increase from the previous record of 7.5 million in 2023 and 150% higher than pre-pandemic levels. The state's charitable food system, including food shelves like Bountiful Basket, is operating at capacity as families struggle with rising food prices, inflation, and stagnant wage growth. While statewide efforts have made strides in combating hunger, the demand for emergency food assistance continues to grow.

With your support, Bountiful Basket Food Shelf remains determined to meet these challenges and needs head-on. Together, we can ensure that everyone who walks through our doors feels welcomed, supported, and empowered to address their food needs. Thank you for being part of this critical mission.
