HOW SHOULD WE CELEBRATE HOLY WEEK?

Holy Week stands at the head of our calendar. It is the holiest week of the year, meaning that we do well to enter into it spiritually in a way that is special, apart from other weeks of the year. Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday and continues through Easter Sunday, celebrating the Paschal Mystery – the passion and death of our Lord, his victorious resurrection, his triumph over sin and death and his glorification of his Father.

Palm Sunday is a dual feast in which we bless and carry palm branches in procession to commemorate the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem and we proclaim the Passion Narrative. It is the only Sunday in which two separate gospels are read. The Mass has two very different moods – jubilation at the outset, like with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and then lamentation as with Jesus' arrest, scourging, agony, and death on a cross. The palms are a great symbol that the people regarded Jesus as their victorious king. But then there are other symbols such as red décor and the crown of thorns that symbolize his passion.

So, how as disciples can we celebrate Palm Sunday very well as a way of entering into Holy Week? Ask the question, "Who is Jesus for me?" Is he my king? Do I honor him always, or when have I turned my back on him? How does his great love for me on the cross move me now? Take a palm home and place it behind a crucifix on your wall. Re-read some of the passion and discuss with your family what it would have been like to be part of the Palm Sunday procession or standing along the way of the Cross as Jesus passed by.

With the arrival of Holy Thursday, the forty days of Lent and its discipline give way to a new three-day fast and discipline, a period of even more intense self-denial in immediate preparation for the greatest feast of all, Easter. It is customary to extend the Lenten discipline three additional days and to make one or more key additions to it. A great way to really enter into the prayer and contemplation of what Jesus has done for us, the way he taught his disciples to serve one another in the washing of the feet, his arrest, passion, death and resurrection, is to make a holy hour sometime after the celebration of the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper and before the 3:00 PM Good Friday Celebration of the Lord's Passion.

The celebration of the Lord's passion is a somber liturgy with no real beginning or end because it continues the commemoration of all the events of the Paschal Mystery, culminating in the celebration of his resurrection at the Easter Vigil. There are three major parts: the proclamation of the Lord's Passion, the adoration of the Cross, and the reception of Holy Communion. Note also that there is an extended, sung set of universal intercessions that are prayed throughout the world. The Lord's Passion is real today. Come to pray at Planned Parenthood at the Solemn Good Friday Prayer Vigil. Details can be found at plam.org/events. It is so important to set aside some very special silent time. Before a crucifix at home, offer Jesus a prayer of thanks for all he suffered on our behalf and to renew your pledge to avoid the sins we have committed that have put him on the cross. Holy Saturday is also meant to be a quiet day in which we recognize that Jesus really did die and through his death conquered death. It is a good practice, if you can, to keep the fast of Good Friday all the way through to the Easter Vigil.

This year, at the Easter Vigil, which begins at 8:30 PM, we will Baptize six Latino youth. They have taken part in the process of growing in understanding and faith in Jesus and we stand in solidarity with them as we renew our own Baptismal promises. Please pray for our newest members of the Christian faith. This is the highest feast of the year because as Saint Paul said, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is in vain" (1 Cor 15:20) and in this firm conviction, we let our praises ring out – and in a special way at the singing of the Exsultet. The Easter Vigil consists in the liturgy of light, the liturgy of the Word, the liturgy of Baptism and the liturgy of the Eucharist. Share the good news with someone! Invite them to Easter Mass. Go out of your way to love someone with all your might because where there is love, there is the risen Christ!
