

MARY, OUR BLESSED MOTHER, PRAY FOR US!

I am borrowing somewhat from the Archbishop's May 12th Weekly Word article when I say that at the heart of God's plan for salvation history was a mother. Saint John Paul II was quick to remind us of that. "A woman" he wrote, "is to be found at the center of this salvific event." And we also celebrated our May Crowning Mass. It is a beautiful thing to watch two of our first communicants come forward with the crown.

As we have celebrated Mother's Day, we can certainly continue our thanksgiving and reflection on those mothers who have so influenced us. My own mother was always around and one whom I could talk to. She was very present to us all. And my godmother, Joanne, has been a special influence as one to have accompanied me throughout my life with my sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Ordination. She is a great evangelizer and watching her interact with others is a special grace. My grandmother, Constance, showed us all great love as she would often travel from Red Lake Falls, MN to see us. Eventually, we began to drive to see her much more. She always gave so much and enjoyed doing so. She would visit a relative who had Multiple Sclerosis in the nursing home and this had a great influence on me to know how an act of kindness can really help someone. I am very blessed to have had so many women in my life who have shown the faith and love of Mary.

Today, as I write this article, it is Our Lady of Fatima, the day of our Archbishop's installation as Archbishop of Saint Paul and Minneapolis nine years ago. Please join me in continuing to reflect upon and give thanks for the mothers in your life. And please join me in praying the Memorare, asking for Mary's intercession upon our Archbishop. "Remember O Most gracious virgin Mary..."

And let us always ask for Mary's intercession upon each other and our parishes by praying the rosary and other prayers which ask for her intercession.


