



#### AN UNDENIABLE GIFT

Around the world at Easter, numerous adults receive baptism; in quite a few countries, there are many thousands. One Catholic Church in Texas was known to have 78 in one year come into the faith through Baptism. Let's pray with hope that such an experience can be ours at our parishes.

I recall once after an Easter Mass at the Cathedral talking with a young woman who was just baptized. I did not know her, but she was beaming with joy and wanted to share it. She explained how God had given her this great day. If you ask the adult baptismal candidates about their personal journey to faith, you will repeatedly hear stories that are

not unlike today's Gospel. Their journey to faith and to baptism is like that of the man born blind to whom Jesus gave the eyesight he had lacked from birth. They experience the transition to faith as a journey to light. In early Christian times, Baptism was described as "enlightenment." And that is why today's Gospel was then, and still is, read as a step in the preparation for baptism.

There is great drama in the event. People begin to ask: What happened, and how did it happen? Who then is this man Jesus who healed you? And again and again, the man who was healed tells what Jesus did and how he has received his sight. And in the process he learns that the more often he talks about it, the more clearly he sees for himself who has healed him and what has been given to him. More and more the healed man becomes a believer and an evangelist.

An important element on this journey is of course the resistance he encounters. The Pharisees do not want to believe him. They swear at him and finally throw him out. But the man who was healed cannot and will not deny what was given to him. He grows because of this hostile rejection. He becomes clearer in his conviction that Jesus is a prophet and even more, the Song of God.

To the degree that I pass on the story of my journey in the faith, my faith becomes firmer, and wherever it proves itself, even against a contradiction and resistance, it becomes deeper and more alive and finally leads, as in today's Gospel, to a full encounter with Jesus Christ.

#### 2022-2023 ANNUAL REPORT ON CATHOLIC EDUCATION IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF SAINT PAUL AND MINNEAPOLIS

The Office for the Mission of Catholic Education is pleased to release the 2022-2023 Annual Report on Catholic Education in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis. Read about the landscape of Catholic education in our Archdiocese, provided through Catholic schools and parish catechetical programs. Some highlights:

#### **Catholic Schools:**

- 53 schools reported that families joined the Catholic Church through their school—200 families and more than 400 people.
- 2. K-12 enrollment has increased 9% over the last three years.
- Our Catholic schools experienced only a 13% teacher turnover rate, bucking national trends.

#### **Parish Catechetical Programs:**

- 1. More than 3,500 volunteer catechists help pass on the faith to children and youth.
- 2. Enrollment in parish catechetical programs remained steady from 2021-2022.
- The number of parish catechetical leaders with a degree in the field (theology, catechesis, religious education, etc.) continues to grow and now sits at 65%.

#### PROTECT YOURSELF FROM ONLINE AND OVER THE PHONE SCAMS

Staff and parishioners alike have seen a recent uptick in people claiming to be Fr. Tony and asking for things. It is important to note that:

- 1. Neither Father Tony or anyone else on staff will email you or text you asking for money. Some other common fake emails are "I need to ask a favor of you discreetly," or "This is a time-sensitive matter and I am relying on you to do this." This will also never happen in real life.
- 2. Never open links in suspicious emails.
- 3. The only electronic communications you should get from us (that do not end in @gachaska.org) are from Flocknote or Rotunda Software (MSP). These emails are easily verifiable, and if you are doubtful, talk to a parish staff member in person. If our communication methods expand or change, we will notify everyone in advance of the change.
- 4. If you have staff cell numbers for ministry reasons (i.e. Faith Formation, Accompanist, Cantor, Funeral Luncheon, etc.), save that phone number in your contacts. That way if you get a text claiming to be from a staff member but is not, you can easily identify it as a fake.
- 5. Common spoof email addresses like to use iterations off of "parishoffice@gmail.com" or "pastorsoffice@gmail.com." Our email addresses end in "@gachaska.org." Also, be sure that all a's, o's, and s's are their correct letters and not 0s, 5s, o's where a's should be, 3's, or other characters.
- 6. Catholic Churches are not the only organizations that have issues with scammers pretending to be someone. Always verify emails, texts, and even letters to ensure the safety of your personal data.
- 7. If you are ever unsure, DO NOT REPLY to the email directly. Always either send a new email to a trusted email address, call a trusted number, or talk to someone in person.
